## Political Pot Boiling Over

### George Wickersham's Letter; Roosevelt Is Very Cautious

WASHINGTON, July 20, (U. P.)—The now famous letter of George W. Wickersham regarding prohibition, aside from arousing nation-wide comment of a varied nature, has set the political pot to boiling furiously. The shades of 1932 presidential ambitions are beginning to appear in the smoke.

Wickersham, past 70 and with no political ambitions of his own, has stirred up the coals with results that may be far beyond the expectations of anyone at present when the 1932 campaign gets under way.

Predictions of what may come in 1932 is futile at this time. But even now, only three days since publication of the Wickersham letter, a familiar political figure rises to seize the occasion furnished by that letter, and from among the governors before whom it was read—Albert C. Ritchie, chief executive of Maryland.

Ritchie defied Wickersham's plea for further state cooperation in prohibition enforcement, thereby, in the opinion of political observers here, denoting an ambition of becoming the champion of the wet and with his eyes on the democratic presidential nomination in 1932.

Ritchie, who will complete in 1932 three consecutive terms, totaling 22 years as governor of Maryland, has been an aspirant for the democratic presidential nomination for a long time. Hitherto, he has been overshadowed as a wet by Alfred E. Smith.

Ritchie, still a comparatively young man, being 53, has attracted considerable notice nationally as governor of Maryland and in the role of champion of state rights. He has been consistently a foe of national prohibition. His state has no enforcement code.

He comes from a border state, one southern enough to attract a following to him as a southerner. He was born in Virginia. There is another governor, however, who has loomed more prominently as a possible democratic presidential candidate in 1932, Franklin D. Roosevelt of New York, to whom the Wickersham letter was addressed. Roosevelt placed Smith's name before three democratic conventions, coining the phrase "the happy warrior." He has been Smith's good man Friday from the start of the Smith movement.

Roosevelt also has expectations, undoubtedly, of the Smith support. That Roosevelt is looking forward to 1932 is indicated by his caution in commenting upon the Wickersham letter. Where Ritchie boldly puts his foot out on the theory, apparently, that he can advance his cause more

It purchased less meat, butter and cheese in June than it did three years ago, the bureau said, but in other foods it represented 113.9 in purchasing power as compared with 1926.

## Discuss Plans For Visit of MacDonald

LONDON, July 20, (UP)—The suggested visit of Prime Minister Ramsay MacDonald to America, to discuss the naval limitation problem with President Hoover, was revived last night with the reliable information that the visit is now the subject of informal discussion.

An authoritative source told the United Press that discussion of the visit, especially as to the date, is now under way in diplomatic channels. The date, it was pointed out, is of great importance as it is desired to make the visit as effective as possible for promotion of naval disarmament.

The semi-official statement was the first which actually confirmed MacDonald's intention of making the trip. It was understood that the Prime Minister has discussed the situation with Ambassador Charles G. Dawes in their recent conference. The general opinion is that the visit cannot occur before September.

Discussion of the visit and its effect on the naval negotiations, the still pending question of resumption of relations with Russia and the question of continuing the British submarine building program held the political stakes today.
