FIRE KILLS YOUNG DEER

ALTURAS, Calif., Aug. 1—One of the results of the big fire which swept up Sugar Hill, last week and ate its way into the heart of the Pandango timber unit, one of the finest bodies of Western Yellow Pine timber in Modoc county, was the destruction of a large number of young deer. District Ranger Laurence L. Smith, in whose district the devastated area is located, estimates that at least 90 per cent of the 1929 fawn crop was destroyed. Fire-fighters report seeing crippled and dead fawns at several points near the fire lines. The loss of domestic stock is not so great as at first supposed, Ranger Smith states. He believes that not over a total of fifty head of cattle met their death in the flames which travelled at race horse speed. Several bands of sheep within the path of the advancing flames were removed to safety before the fire reached their range.
