

PETERSON BACK FROM MEETING

Fred R. Peterson, county superintendent of schools, home from a state meeting of county superintendents held in Salem where he presided as chairman, found problems of transportation, finances and individual instruction important discussions.

Mr. Peterson found a number of schools of the state in favor of the adoption of some form of supervised study and individual instruction.

An experiment along this line was carried on last year in the Mallin school and in a limited way at Henley. The new method worked out to the satisfaction of Mr. Peterson.

Individual instruction does away with the necessity for group recitations and enables a pupil to advance as rapidly as his ability permits. The same amount of subject matter is covered with an economy of the time of the teacher and pupil.

Klamath county is relieved of many problems in regard to transportation which trouble administrators in other parts of the state. This, according to Mr. Peterson, because of the county unit system which is in force here. This prevents competition and conflict among competing districts which frequently develops under the local district plan.

The need for a uniform system of budgeting and accounting was recognized by the superintendents in their conference but it was found impossible even with the suggestions of an ad hoc finance committee, to work out a satisfactory plan for putting this in effect.

Two central themes for teachers' institutes for the year were adopted by the school heads. These were the study of the plans of individual instruction and the teaching of good citizenship and law enforcement.

ESCAPE-PROOF JAIL FAILS TO HOLD PRISONER

PALATINE, Ill., Aug. 16. (A.P.)—The reason Palatine didn't dedicate its new, escape-proof jail this week was because the prisoner, captured especially for the event, escaped.

The dedication was to have been held Tuesday. On Monday night, therefore, policemen accosted the town for a jail guest, finally arresting A. L. Flaska of Chicago. The following day found Flaska was gone, he having decided that the escape-proof jail was merely a figure of speech.

Chicago police yesterday arrested Flaska and held him on a charge of jail breaking for Palatine officers. It is not unlikely that when the Palatine jail is dedicated next week its prisoner will be Flaska, and the charge against him will be escaping from the jail being dedicated.

BUS DRIVERS' MEETING SET

Fred R. Peterson, county superintendent of schools has called a meeting of bus drivers for Monday afternoon, September 2 at Fremont school.

At the same time there will be a meeting for those who are acting as janitors of the rural schools.

Traffic laws, operation and repair problems will be discussed by experts for the benefit of the men who drive the Klamath county school busses.

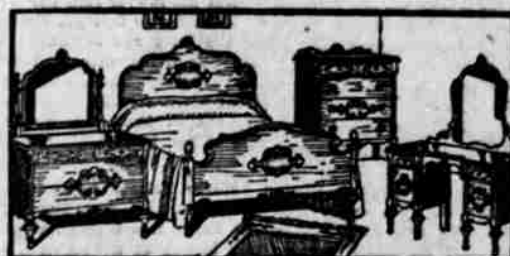

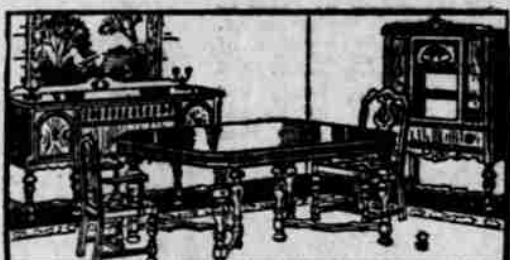
