MUFFINS GOOD FOR ANY MEAL

Papovers
1 cup flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup milk
1 egg
Mix the salt and flour, beat the eggs slightly and mix with the milk; all to the dry ingredients. Beat only enough to mix well, and pour into hot buttered gossypers or custard cups. Bake in a hot oven (450 degrees F.) 30 minutes, then turn out the fire or open the door, and keep in the oven for 10 minutes.

Blueberry Muffins
1/2 cup butter
1/2 cup sugar
1 egg
1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
2-3 cups flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup milk
1 cup berries
Cream the butter and sugar together and add egg well beaten; mix and sift flour, baking powder and salt and add alternately with the milk. Add the berries with the rest of the flour. Pour into greased muffin pans and bake in a hot oven (400 degrees F.) 20 minutes.

Brain Muffins
2 tablespoons shortening
1/2 cup sugar
1 egg
1 cup sour milk
1 cup bran
1 cup flour
1/2 teaspoon soda
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
Cream shortening and sugar together. Add the egg. Mix and sift flour, soda, salt and baking powder. To the creamed mixture add the bran, then the milk, alternately with the sifted dry ingredients. Pour into greased muffin tins and bake in a moderate oven (375 degrees F.) for 20 minutes. If sweet milk is used instead of sour milk omit the one-half teaspoon soda and use three teaspoons of baking powder. Raisins or dates may be added to the muffins if desired. If you prefer a molasses flavor, molasses may replace the sugar. In that case use a little less milk.

Date or Raisin Muffins
To any of the muffin recipes add 1/2 cup seedless raisins or 1/2 cup cut dates. The rich muffin recipe or the bran muffins are particularly good when fruit is added. If baked in very small muffin pans these fruit muffins are well adapted for serving at afternoon tea.

Chopped Vegetable Relish
1/2 cup pepper tomatoes, peeled and chopped
1 cup chopped onions
2 cups chopped red peppers
1 cup chopped green peppers
1-3 cup salt
1 cup sugar
2 cups chopped celery
1/2 cup whole white mustard seed
1 teaspoon cloves
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon allspice
1 quart vinegar
Mix all the ingredients. Let stand for one day. Pour into sterilized jars and seal.

Fruit Dressing
(For fruit or lettuce salads)
2 egg yolks or 1 egg
2 tablespoons flour
4 tablespoons sugar
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon dry mustard
1/4 teaspoon paprika
1/4 teaspoon lemon juice
1/4 cup orange juice
1/4 cup water
Beat the egg yolks and add the dry ingredients. Blend well and add the rest of the ingredients. Cook in a double boiler, stirring frequently, until the dressing thickens. Beat for one minute. Pour into a jar and when cool, store in the ice box.

Peach Cake
2 cups flour
4 teaspoons baking powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
4 tablespoons lard
2-3 cup milk
2 tablespoons soft butter
2 cups fresh, sliced peaches (canned peaches may be used.)
1/4 cup light brown sugar
1 teaspoon cinnamon
Mix the flour, baking powder and salt. Cut in the lard with a knife. Slowly add the milk until a soft dough forms. Pat out until two-thirds inch thick and place in a shallow, greased pan. Spread with the butter, add the peaches and sprinkle with the sugar and cinnamon. Bake in a moderate oven for 25 minutes. Cut in squares and serve warm or cold.

CANTALOUPE SHERBET
Two large cantaloupes, 2 lemons, 1 1/2 cups sugar, 1 1/2 cups water, 2 teaspoons granulated gelatin, few grains of salt.
Remove pulp and juice from melons and press through coarse sieve. Add lemon juice. Soften gelatin in 2 tablespoons cold water. Bring sugar and water to boiling point and add softened gelatin. Let stand until cool and add first mixture with salt. Turn into cold mold and freeze in five parts ice to one part salt.

CRISP SALADS
Crisp salads, fresh vegetables and fruits, with less meat and cereals, provide an attractive and satisfying diet for hot weather. Vegetables served raw are always best if crisp and cold. Allowing them to stand for a half hour in cold water before serving will accomplish this. Any left-overs, such as lettuce, cabbage or celery, if placed in a tightly closed container, will retain their crispness for several days.

ICE IMPLEMENTS
When serving iced beverages to many guests, be sure to have handy implements. A sharp pick, an ice bag to crack it in, and ice cracker and hammer are all necessary. A small expenditure of money saves much time and temper.

LIME CHIFFON
Stunning is a lime colored chiffon dance frock with long points and fluttering ends. One shoulder strap is of brilliant and a bertha of chiffon embroidered in brilliant outlines the low back décolletage.

LONG-LIMBED SILHOUETTE
All the new fall models suggest the normal waistline and longer skirts which give a long-limbed silhouette that flares low.

CORN SOUFFLE

Six ears corn, 1/4 cup soft bread crumbs, 4 tablespoons of butter, 1/4 cup milk, 1 teaspoon salt, 1-2 teaspoon pepper, 2 yolks eggs, 3 whites of eggs.
Scare rows of kernels, cut off tops and scrape with blunt edge of knife. Melt butter, stir in bread crumbs and add milk. Cook, stirring constantly until thick and smooth. Add prepared corn, salt and pepper and cook three minutes longer. Beat yolks of eggs until thick and lemon colored. Add to corn mixture. Beat whites of eggs with a wire whisk until stiff and dry. Fold into first mixture and turn into a buttered baking dish. Bake 25 minutes in a moderate oven. Serve at once or the souffle will fall.

HOW TO CHOOSE
When you go to market for muskmelons—or cantaloupes as just shut your eyes and pick, or do you conscientiously and rather fearfully choose to the best of your knowledge?

There are certain characteristics for which melon-wise buyers have learned to search. Perhaps the most conspicuous of these is the netting. A close netting completely covering the melon usually assures—in ripe fruit—that sweetness of flavor, fineness of texture and abundance of flesh so desirable in cantaloupes. Some varieties show closer interlacing than others, but in all types of netting it's the closeness that counts.

Weight is another important factor in selecting muskmelons.

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A large square of chiffon with one corner heavily embroidered with paillettes is newer for evening than the plain chiffon handkerchief.

WINDOW FROCKS ARE PREDICTED
"Daring" is a weak word to use in describing the creations which Paris promises for the near future. Mlle. Therese Clémenceau, daughter of the "Tiger" of France, sends startling warnings from the capital of chic of frocks with windows and evening wear with trousers:
"Simple practical dresses of this season are provided with little windows. There are no shutters or glass panes and no curtains through which one can peep. Nevertheless they are windows, consisting of an oval, round or square opening. The edge may have a piping of the same material as the dress, or may be embroidered in bright silk. To safeguard our morals, however, all that can be seen through these windows is a slip worn underneath, the color and fabric of which have been carefully selected. These openings may be small and numerous or large and few and far between. These, in a word, are the counterpart of a simple work."

LATE BLOOMS
The best way to keep plants blooming is to pick flowers the minute they are opened. A geranium bed can be kept blooming indefinitely, for instance, if the blooms are never allowed to stay on until they fade.

STRAWBERRIES WITH PINEAPPLE

Strawberries with pineapple make an especially charming salad. Choose large, handsome berries and quarter them, reserving a few very nice ones for garnishing. To the quartered berries add an equal quantity of fresh or canned pineapple, shredded not too fine, and pour over the fruits a sweetened French dressing made with lemon or orange juice in place of vinegar. Let stand half an hour in a very cold place. Then arrange crisp inside leaves of lettuce on individual plates. On each place a cross cut slice of orange and heap with the fruit; top with a ripe berry. Radiating from the orange slices on the lettuce arrange five thin strips of Swiss-herland cheese. Serve with little salted crackers, toasted or not, as preferred.

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GIVE SWEET CORN

Sweet corn always is popular on a vegetable and a boon to most housewives.
No matter how sweet corn is cooked, be sure not to overcook it. For long cooking makes it tough and tasteless. Corn is one of those vegetables like peas which loses its natural sweetness very quickly after picking and should be cooked as soon as possible. Drop it into boiling, unsalted water and boil eight minutes. This length of time "sets" the milk in the kernels and cooks the hulls just enough to make them tender. Long cooking is ruinous.

Corn Chowders are good for the first nippy days of autumn but seem a bit hot for August weather. Succotash is that time-honored combination of corn and beans our fore-mothers learned from the Indians.

Corn souffle is delicate and ideal for hot weather.
