

SENATE DROPS VARE TO TAKE TARIFF DEBATE

**Pennsylvanian's Case To
Be Settled In De-
cember.**

WASHINGTON, Sept. 13 (AP)—With consideration of the three-year-old question of seating William A. Vare as senator from Pennsylvania postponed until December, the tariff bill today held undisputed right of way in the senate.

By a vote of 41 to 34, the Vare case late yesterday was deferred until congress meets in regular session, so that no time would be lost in getting into the thick of the tariff battle.

The administrative provisions of the bill drawn up by the finance committee majority were open to debate, under an agreement which placed these ahead of the sections dealing specifically with rate schedules. They were made the initial order of business under a motion of Senator Simmons, ranking minority member of the finance committee which was approved yesterday.

Thus several controversial clauses of the tariff bill were up for consideration at the very start, including the flexible provisions, the tariff commission and the proposed substitution of domestic for foreign values in assessing ad valorem duties. To speed up debate, it was agreed that initial reading would be dispensed with.

The opening assault of the opposition to the republican measure was embodied in a lengthy address prepared for delivery today by Senator Simmons.

The vote on deferment of the Vare case was not regarded as a test of strength on that issue or on the tariff. It was urged by republican leaders solely as a means of expediting tariff legislation. When the Vare issue is brought before the senate on Dec. 3, it is to be kept before the body until a vote is reached.

THREE AIRMEN KILLED

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 13. (A P)—Three men were killed at Mills field here today when an airplane went into a tail spin and crashed, bursting into flames as it fell. The dead: Pilot Aubert J. Hansel, Walter Nelson and Robert Parker, all of San Francisco. Apparently they were killed instantly.

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LOTS OF MAIL HANDLED HERE

The entire local postoffice force has been busy for some time with a record income of mail. During the time from the Labor day celebration to the following Friday, Sept. 6, 5,125 Montgomery Ward catalogs were delivered in Klamath Falls, constituting several truck loads of magazines.

At the same time the carriers delivered the new telephone books to patrons in the city. The number of these books delivered was 2,307.

In addition to the regular work being carried on now at the postoffice an additional typist, Mrs. Mary McQueen, has been engaged for the extra work of compiling the new directory.

Address slips were given out some time ago on which was written all people getting their mail at the address. A slip was placed at each residence in town, in each postoffice box and all R. F. D. boxes. However, there are still some of these slips that have not yet been turned in, according to the postmaster, who requests that people still holding the slips turn them in immediately.

As the slips are turned into the office they are copied alphabetically into the old directory which was compiled two years ago. These, in turn, are made into a new directory, which, when complete, will contain more than 6,000 names. Five books are used for the directory, numbered as follows: A-E, F-K, H-N, L-R, S-Z.

KVALE'S DEATH WAS ACCIDENT

FERGUS FALLS, Minn., Sept. 13. (AP)—Death of Congressman O. J. Kvale, of the seventh Minnesota district, was "accidental," county authorities said. Thursday and no inquest will be held.

Mr. Kvale's charred body was found in the ruins of his cottage near Battle Lake, Minn., early yesterday. The cottage had been destroyed by fire, which is believed to have been started by the explosion of a gasoline lamp, according to Coroner J. G. Vigen, who investigated.

The body was brought here last night and funeral services will be held Sunday at his home at Benson.
