

### BUTLER VISITS KLAMATH FALLS

Congressman Robert R. "Bob" Butler of The Dalles arrived in Klamath Falls last night from Lakeview and will interview local citizens during the next few days.

Learning of the planned railroad celebration to be held Saturday, Congressman Butler started arranging his plans to allow time to attend the fête, which he characterizes as a "great thing for the state and especially for the Klamath country."

He states that the Klamath Falls federal building bill and the reclamation canal covering or tunneling measures will be brought up at the regular session of congress, which will convene on the first Monday in December.

Congressman Butler will leave Oregon early in October for the capital, where he will attend the opening of the special session of the house of representatives, which is now awaiting senate action on the proposed tariff bill.

In speaking of the tariff bill, Representative Butler stated that the house bill differs from the bill which the senate is considering and which Senator Charles L. McNary of Oregon has stated he will oppose.

"The tariff bill, as drawn in the house measure, favors Oregon products and farm products in general," Congressman Butler said.

The senate bill, he explained, was revised and the tariff as proposed on many farm crops was greatly reduced from the original in the house tariff measure.

Representative Butler is endorsing the measure as passed by the house of representatives.

### LEWIS RECEIVES TEN-YEAR TERM

Ten years in the state penitentiary was the sentence imposed upon A. E., alias James Lewis, yesterday by Circuit Judge W. M. Duncan after Lewis pleaded guilty to a charge of holdup and robbery while being armed with a dangerous weapon.

Lewis waived preliminary hearing, indictment by the grand jury and went before Judge Duncan. He was accused with Floyd Dempsey of holding up the night man at the Imperial garage on August 30, and escaping with \$56.70.

Joe Aguirre, Mexican, charged with assault with a dangerous weapon on the person of Pedro Lira, fellow Mexican, at Algoma on July 23, went before Judge Duncan and after waiving indictment by the grand jury was sentenced to five years in the state penitentiary.

T. R. Gillenwaters presented a motion to Judge Duncan asking that the parole of Ted Bower be revoked. Bower was convicted of forgery by material alteration on January 4, 1928, sentenced to two years and paroled on condition that he did not break any more laws. He is now serving a sentence in the county jail after conviction by a justice court jury on a charge of sale of intoxicating liquor. Judge Duncan took the matter under advisement for a few days.

The board of directors of the company made the announcement last night. The F. J. Shea company of Portland was awarded the contract for construction.
