

SANTA MARIA VOLCANO DOES HEAVY DAMAGE

Estimated 400 People Killed and Farms Ruined

GUATEMALA CITY, Nov. 7. (AP)—The Guatemalan minister of promotion has informed the government, after a visit to El Palmar and the zone affected by eruption of the volcano Santa Maria, that the eruption has ceased. Heavy showers fell over the entire area yesterday.

He was not able to estimate loss of human life or property damage since many localities were still surrounded by molten lava. The Red Cross, the Boy Scouts and women of the district have begun active relief work.

Some official quarters yesterday estimated the number of dead at as high as 400.

Damage Heavy

One newspaper said authorities calculated as many as 45 deaths from the disaster, with as much as \$1,000,000 loss to the farms through the molten lava. Twenty-one bodies have been recovered at El Palmar. There are 25,000 inhabitants in the affected area.

Eleven persons injured in the eruption were brought to the nearby town of San Felipe with bad burns on their faces and hands from steam which arose when yesterday's rain fell on the molten lava. They said great balls of fire had fallen on ranches near the volcano.

Flyer Describes Scene

D. G. Richardson, superintendent of operations of the Mexican aviation company, called the Associated Press yesterday after a flight over the volcano area: "I saw something which will live in my memory, an island surrounded by a moving mass of lava which must be getting higher and higher. And on the island were men, women, and children trapped with no hope of escaping a horrible death unless old Santa Maria so decrees."

OFFICERS MAKE LIQUOR HAUL

More than 100 gallons of intoxicating liquor was seized yesterday afternoon by Federal Officer Louis Mueller and Deputy Sheriff Lloyd Linville who arrested Charles Lenhart at a house said to belong to Fred Lyons in Altamont Acres.

The seizure which included a large amount of empty bottles and equipment is one of the largest ever made here and it is thought that it will stop the source of supply for a number of "small peddlars." Officer Mueller states. The liquor and equipment seized is valued at about \$2,500.

Lenhart is held in jail and a state charge of possession will be filed against him. Mueller stated last night that he will swear out a warrant for the arrest of Lyons, who is said to be the owner of the house where the liquor was found and who has been convicted previously on liquor charges.
