MANY TITLES ARE AT STAKE ON GRIDIRON

Saturday's Games To Decide Standings Of Most Teams

NEW YORK, Nov. 15, (AP)—The odds are with the home forces in the big conflicts of the gridiron tomorrow. If Soldier Field is considered as "home" for Notre Dame in its clash with the Trojans of Southern California.

In the five games of most significance so far as the championship situation is concerned, nationally, the Hoosiers figure to start with an advantage over Carnegie Tech. Tennessee is a slight favorite over Vanderbilt in the outstanding southern fray. Purdue seems primed to stop Iowa, and Yale looks too strong for the Princeton Tiger.

Underdogs May Repeat
It will take tomorrow's fray to determine whether the bearish movement among the favorites is still on, with the underdogs again enjoying a field day such as they had last week.

One of the contrasting features of these outstanding games tomorrow is that while less than 50,000 spectators will witness the Tennessee-Vanderbilt and Purdue-Iowa games, because of the limited facilities, approximately 250,000 will see the other three games.

120,000 Fans Expected
Close to 120,000 fans are expected to pack huge Soldier Field for the Notre Dame-Southern California contest, with 75,000 in the Yale bowl and more than 80,000 in Pitt stadium.

The Iowa-Purdue battle, with the Big Ten championship aspirations of the Boilermakers at stake, would just about pack any arena in the Middle West, but the capacity of the Ross-Add stadium at Lafayette is not much over 20,000. The same thing is true of the Tennessee-Vanderbilt contest, which involves the Southern conference title hopes of each team.

Cornell Unbeaten
In nearly every sector of combat tomorrow promises to witness close and exciting action between old rivals. In the East, Cornell stakes an unbeaten record against Dartmouth with at least an outside chance of victory. Colgate is the favorite against Syracuse, but this ancient rivalry is replete with the evidence of upsets.

The Big Ten, with Iowa and Purdue holding the spotlight, NEW YORK, Nov. 15, (AP)—tempt to keep within striking distance of the top by seeking the scalp of Michigan and Chicago respectively. Defeat for Purdue will scramble the entire situation.

Nebraska Leads
Nebraska will move a notch toward the Big Six title if it triumphs over Oklahoma, although the Cornhuskers will have the Kansas Aggies and Iowa State to meet.

After an epidemic of scoreless battles, the Southwestern conference hopes to produce more decisive action when Baylor meets Southern Methodist and Texas tackles Texas Christian. All four are in the championship scrap.

California's tussle with Washington takes on added interest—a 6-0 margin, but California's Bears figure to win and stay at the top of the Conference heap.

Students Hurl Eggs When Dean Objects To Conduct

DES MOINES, Nov. 15, (AP)—Student revolts against the attitude of Drake University authorities toward the campus warfare with Iowa State college as a prelude to the school's football game at Ames tomorrow flared into open indignation early today with a rotten egg bombardment of the home of R. O. Davies, dean of men.

Davies last night refused to consider a petition asking for the reinstatement of six Drake students who were suspended for painting signs on Iowa State buildings and sidewalks yesterday. He told the group who presented the petition that it would have to come through the student council before he would consider it.

In retaliation, a dozen or more students came to his home shortly after midnight this morning at 1 a. m., rushed to the house and plastered the front of it with eggs.

They disappeared in three automobiles before they could be identified.

Shortly before the egg episode, and effigy of Dean Davies, bearing a sign of "Dean Hawkshaw," was hanged on the campus in front of the administration building.

The six suspended students included all the Drake cheer leaders. More than 300 students signed the petition asking that they be reinstated to lead the cheering section at Ames Saturday.

Davies, upon hearing of the petition, remarked: "It will not matter a great deal to me if there are no cheer leaders."

Both the Iowa State and Drake campuses received deluges of paint as a result of yesterday's activities, students from each school invading the other's campus.

The team and some 1000 "camp followers" are traveling on a 12-coach special train, due in Chicago tonight.

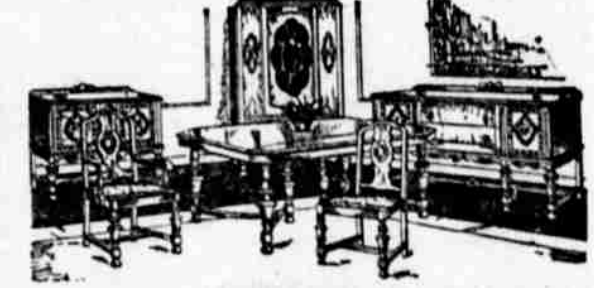
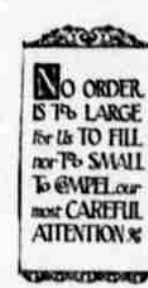
BAND SERENADES NOTABLE
