

PIERCE NAMES WEATHERFORD FOR GOVERNOR

Ex-Governor Says He
Favors Albany Man
For Office.

SALEM, Ore., Nov. 29. (AP)—"Mark Weatherford of Albany is my ideal candidate for the governorship," was the statement of Walter Pierce of La Grande, ex-governor, who was in Salem yesterday. "He is chairman of the state committee, he is centrally located as to population and he would put on a wonderful campaign. I know he was defeated once by Willis Hawley for congress but you know everybody loves Hawley. That doesn't mean anything. Why I have been defeated myself."

"Will I be a candidate? Remember I have been three times at bat and knocked one home run."

"But some of these times a little later the boys will get together and iron the matter out. It will be up to the boys to decide. I am not saying I won't be a candidate if the boys decide that is the best thing for the party. Nor am I saying I will. No-no. Don't say I am in a receptive mood, because that isn't it at all. I am merely saying if the boys think that is the way it will be it is too early, much too early, for me to say that I would turn them down flatly."

"And then there is Bert Haney of Portland. He is another man who would make a wonderful campaign and a wonderful governor."

"Those are the only two I have heard talked at all as logical candidates for the next turn at the wheel. Mark Weatherford is a grand fellow and would make a high-class governor as well as a great run for the party and the place."

Lakeshore Folks
Seek To Establish
Game Protection

Premont Bridge, Lakeshore Drive, the Geary brothers ranch, and other private property has been invaded this season by hordes of would-be nimrods. "No trespass" signs seem to lure them on rather than to curb their activities. In spite of the law, these mighty seekers after game shoot from the highways and bridges, and on private land.

One incident was related by a prominent resident of this district. An ambitious hunter was trying out a new long range, high-powered rifle, shooting from the highway at sea-gulls. Not only was he violating two laws, but was endangering the lives of workmen across the lake. Not allowing for the ricochet of the bullets on the water, the range of the rifle was approximately 15,000 feet. Workmen in the rock quarries, and even in the lumber yards across the lake are unsafe if these conditions are allowed to continue.

It has been suggested that the lower end of the Upper Lake be turned into a game preserve, and also that the hills above the lake be included. The Geary brothers have offered to turn 1000 acres into this refuge, and it is thought that the McCormacks, other large land holders in that district, would include their land. Soon a petition will be circulated among the residents of Lakeshore Gardens, and further action taken legally to establish a game preserve.

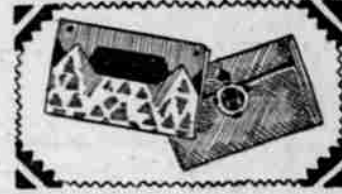
