R. B. Hartenbower Here—

R. B. Hartenbower, who was in Klamath Falls for some time several months ago working and completing the contract for the disposal plant, a unit of the city's sewer plans, has returned here for a short visit. Mr. Hartenbower expressed a pleasure at being able to visit Klamath once more and plans to return here next summer. He is now located in Missoula, Montana, where he has a contract for construction of 17 miles of sewer. He is returning to Missoula this week-end, going by way of Portland and Spokane and plans to be in Missoula Monday. Mr. Hartenbower is the father of Bernice Hartenbower, who was employed at the chamber of commerce this summer.

Visit Malin Section—

R. E. Hayden, superintendent of the Klamath reclamation project, Joe Jacobs of the Klamath irrigation district, C. C. Seeley, resident state highway engineer, County Judge Fred R. Goddard, Engineer E. B. Henry, and Roadmaster Charles Spidell yesterday toured the section in the Malin and Merrill neighborhood.

The officials were studying the drainage conditions in that district in which all organizations represented would be interested. It would affect county roads, state highways, the Klamath district and the reclamation project's property.

W. H. Cooke In Portland—

W. H. Cooke is at the Imperial from Klamath Falls, where the government proposes to construct a federal building the coming year. The Klamath Falls federal building is on the Hoover program and action is expected early in March. The Weyerhaeuser mill, just being completed, four miles west of Klamath Falls, will begin operating next month. For the first six months the operation will be in the nature of a test of the machinery and the lumber turned out will be for the use of mill buildings. Full operation is not expected before next June. The mill, when running at capacity, will provide employment for several hundred men and will add materially to the payroll of Klamath Falls.—Oregonian.
