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Today's Markets

PORTLAND, Dec. 7. (AP)—The produce markets were quiet and unimpressive today. There was the usual week-end buying early in the morning, but prices for the most part remained unchanged. Because of the continued mild weather an abundance of green vegetables are still found at reasonable prices.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the United States department of agriculture says:

Receipts of homegrown vegetables on the wholesale market today light. Cauliflower comprises nearly one-half of the total truck arrivals. Quality of cauliflower is not quite so good as former offerings, but the market continues steady. At 1.40 per crate for best stock, in carlots, and motor-truck shipments to the Puget Sound district.

The bunched vegetables—carrots, beets, turnips, radishes, etc., continue quite plentiful, and cheap; quality, although good, is not fancy. Spinach is meeting with slow demand, and prices are low.

California lettuce is of rather poor quality at present—at least, so far as Portland arrivals are concerned. Hope is expressed that quality will soon improve, as the Imperial valley and other new-crop areas are just starting shipments.

High medium to good steers, \$10.00 to \$11.00; less desirable kinds, \$9 to \$9.75; commons down to \$7; good heifers, mostly \$9.00 to \$9.40 with one outstanding load Monday at \$9.75; top cows in loads, \$8.10; odd head, \$5.50; bulk desirable she stock, \$7.50; up; top cutters down to \$5.00; cutter to fairly good bulls, \$6.50 to \$7.50; odd head butcher type

at \$8.00; best light vealers, \$12; calves, \$10.00 down; off grades down to \$8.00.
