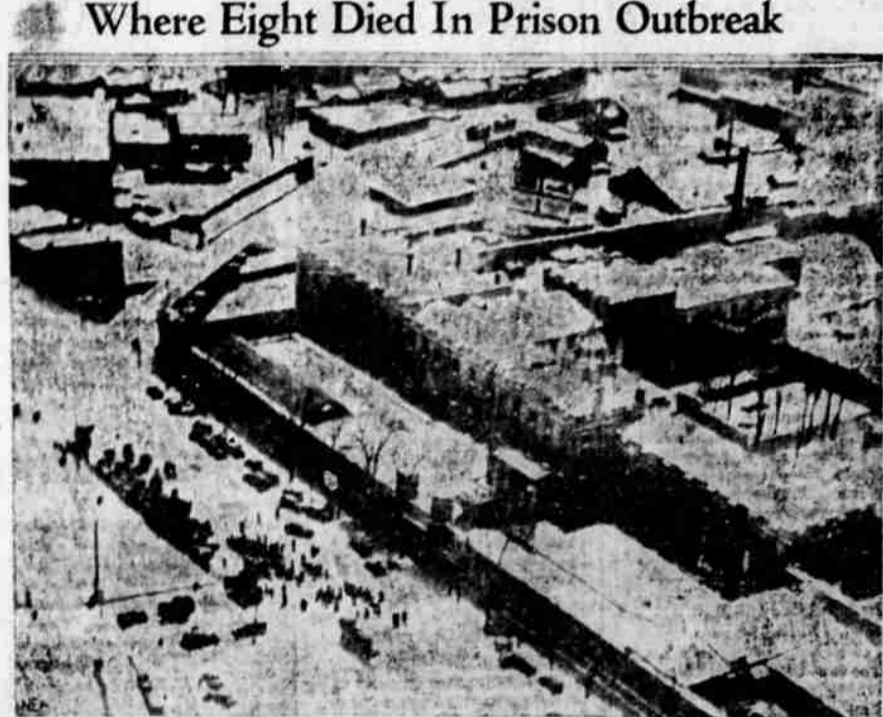

I. C. C. FAVORS PUBLIC SERVICE BOARD PETITION
Construction of 181 Miles From Crane to Crescent Lake Will Give Oregon New Line to East. Report Says U. P. Will Carry Case Into Courts.
WASHINGTON, Dec. 13 (AP)—The Interstate Commerce Commission today for the first time asserted its power to compel a railroad to build, against its will, extensive new lines, when it directed the Union Pacific System to construct 181 miles of line between Crane and Crescent Lake, Oregon, at an approximate cost of \$9,000,000.
