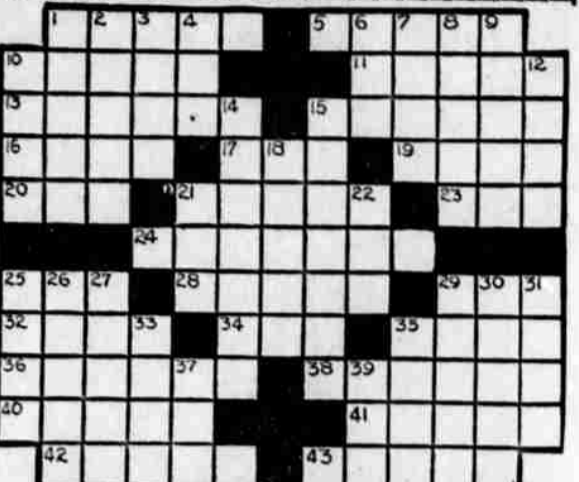

George Pan, for many years a well known Chinese resident of this city, has been in jail in China for some time because he was a rebel partisan and in revolt against the government.

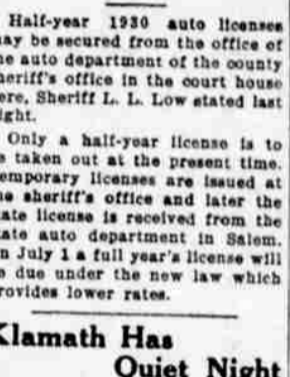
