

### KIRKWOOD AND DUTRA DIVIDE \$3,500 PURSE

Finals Played in Rain Which Drove Some Players Away.

LONG BEACH, Cal., Jan. 6. (AP)—Olin Dutra and Joe Kirkwood, respectively Santa Monica, Cal., and Philadelphia, professional golfers, today possessed the divided honors of winning the fifth annual Long Beach 3550 open golf tournament. Unsettled rain, which had not fallen in noticeable amount in southern California for nine months, drove leading contenders from the field during Sunday's final 36 holes.

Play Sensational As dusk was falling Kirkwood turned in a sensational 70 to equal Dutra's first money score of 216, thus winning a fifty-fifty split of the \$1600 first money.

Dark horse mudders found the mud puddles and squidgy greens to their liking, and Clarence Clark, young Tulsa, Okla., pro, ploughed into second prize money with a 69-76-73 for a total of 218.

Dutra's card for the 54 holes was 67-76-73-216, and Kirkwood's 68-78-70-216.

Henry Gulcl, of Bridgeport, Conn., took third place with a 219, and Johnny Rogers, Denver, Colo., pro, fourth with a total of 220.

Sever Leading Amateur Young Charles Sever, 17 year old, Los Angeles prep school amateur, who led the qualifiers Saturday with a 66, one short of the course record, beat George Von Elm, Detroit amateur, for the amateur prize. He tied with Johnny Farrell, of St. Augustine, Fla., Charles Guest of Hollywood, Cal., and W. H. Cox of Brooklyn, N. Y., for fifth place in the medal play, with a 221.

### Commits Crime, Gets Sentence All in One Day

PORTLAND, Jan. 6. (AP)—Police, an irate victim of a robber and the county grand jury gave Don O'Day, gunman, within 30 minutes yesterday a lasting explanation of what the Oregon judicial council discussed throughout the day here.

O'Day went out to rob and had a busy afternoon. At 1 o'clock he robbed Joe Boxer, belligerent clerk in a clothing store. For five minutes O'Day was being chased by Boxer and a friend. Ten minutes later he was found in a theater and was arrested.

At 1:30 o'clock he signed a confession, police said. Then things happened. He was booked, taken before a municipal judge where he waived preliminary hearing and taken before the grand jury which indicted him.

### Gas Fume Blast Demolishes Shop

GRANTS PASS, Ore., Jan. 6. (UP)—A welding shop owned by Ted Edinger was wrecked by an explosion of carbide gas which had gathered under the floor today.

Roy Fixen, who was working inside the shop was thrown across the room, but was only slightly injured.

Brick walls of adjoining buildings were bulged by the force of the explosion and windows were broken in the hotel Del Rogue across the street, and other adjacent buildings.

A number of pedestrians had narrow escapes from being struck by flying debris. Cause of the explosion had not been exactly determined.
