GREAT ARTHUR TOO BUSY TO HEAR INQUIRY

Goes to St. Paul Today For Match With Tony Faeth.

CHICAGO, Jan. 7. (AP)—Charles Arthur (the Great) Shires does not propose to permit meetings of state athletic commission to cause him to disappoint his public.

While he is more or less lauded on the boxing business, the great one is still after money, and decided not to attend the meeting of the Illinois state athletic commission this afternoon, so that he might go through with a bout at St. Paul tonight.

Too Busy to Explain

C. Arthur said he could not attend the meeting which was arranged for him to explain some things about his meeting with mysterious dangerous Dan Daly of Cleveland, and still have time to fulfill his engagement in St. Paul, with Tony Faeth, a baseball pitcher. Rather than disappoint the fans he decided to pass up the meeting. And too, he still is considerably short of the \$250,000 he hopes to get out of boxing.

To Talk After Fight

Kessie Blumenthal, the sky one's manager, said Mrs. Blumenthal today would notify the commission that neither fighter nor manager could attend the meeting. Blumenthal also outlined Shires' itinerary for the next few days. The great man will return to Chicago after the St. Paul fight, but will pause only as long as it takes to catch a train for Lansing, Mich., where the Michigan boxing commission plans to delive into the circumstances surrounding Shires' proposed bout with Battling Criss of Rockwood, Mich. Criss manager has charged that a Shires' representative requested the fighter to fold up in the fight, and C. Arthur has been invited to explain.

May Yet Fight Criss

If the Michigan commission is convinced nothing is amiss, Shires will fulfill the date with Criss. He then plans to return to Chicago, where he hopes to talk baseball contract with the White Sox management.

Shires may encounter difficulty when he seeks an audience with the Sox management, for Secretary Harry Grabner has said the first baseman must clear himself of all charges before the club will be ready to consider offering him a contract.

TROUT FISHING ONE OF CRATER LAKE'S LURES

Superintendent of Park Says Many Visit Lake to Fish.

The following article from the Oregonian will be read with a great deal of interest by Klamath residents. It deals with fish planting in Crater Lake.

"An integral part of the attractions of national parks is furnished by the streams and lakes. In all ages water has had the greatest influence on the spread of civilization.

"Crater lake park, without its magnificent lake and its companion Rogue river," says E. C. Solinsky, superintendent, "and Yosemite and Yellowstone without their waters would be like golden frames without pictures. Hardly second to the barrenness of such a vision would be a conception of these lakes and streams without fish.

"It is the aim of the national park service to see that no fishless condition shall ever exist. And yet there was once a time when no fish swam in Crater lake. All the fine fishing that is enjoyed there now by thousands of visitors is due to artificial plantings. The very conditions surrounding the creation of Crater lake precluded the possibility of fish being native to its waters.

"The first trout planted in Crater lake were cutthroats—those gamey native aristocrats of the Rocky mountains, the predominant fish in waters of southern Oregon. Later native Pacific coast fish, such as the rainbow, steelhead and lake Tahoe trout and silverside salmon were introduced.

"It is evident that increasing effort will have to be put forth by the national park service to maintain good angling in the wild playgrounds of the nation, in the face of an increasingly large number of fishermen tourists and vacationists. The national park service, assisted by the federal bureau of fisheries has adopted a new plan of studying various species of fish to ascertain which may be best adapted to the waters of variously located parks.

"The waters will be surveyed, a check will be kept upon the fish therein, and the denizens of the waters will receive the same assiduous care and attention that has been given to other forms of wild life in the national parks.

Colonel C. G. Thomson, whom I succeeded at Crater lake park last year, now superintendent of Yosemite national park, began several years ago a study to find out what fish are best adapted to Crater lake. In continuing this

investigation I have almost come to the conclusion that the dashing, tigerish, landlocked silverside trout will be king of all sports fish in the blue waters of Crater lake, in future. Although originally an ocean fish, the silverside has become the largest, most ferocious fighter of all the trout family when landlocked."

Kieckhefer Upsets Billiard Tourney

NEW YORK, Jan. 7. (AP)—A surprising stand by Augie Kieckhefer, Chicago southpaw, has knocked one corner off the triangular race for the national three cushion billiards championship, leaving it a duel between Otto Reiselt of Philadelphia and Allan Hall of St. Louis.

After breaking even in the first two games, Kieckhefer last night defeated Johnny Layton of St. Louis, defending champion, 59 to 28 in 53 innings. It was Layton's first defeat in three years of tournament competition. Reiselt and Hall still are undefeated.

Yesterday Hall beat Harry Schuler of New York, 59 to 15 in 43 innings while Reiselt turned in a 49 inning victory over Tiff Denton of Kansas City, 50 to 37.

Gus Copulos of Detroit yesterday beat Charles Jordan of Los Angeles, 50 to 45 in 61 innings.
