AT THE PELICAN

Romance, drama, thrills—a girl of high society caught in the coils of the underworld—that, briefly, is "The Racketeer." Pathé's all-dialogue production, starring Robert Armstrong, at the Pelican theatre now. Carol Lombard is featured.

Written by Paul Gangelin and directed by Howard Higgin, this feature is said by preview critics to be the most accurate screen painting to date of that mysterious figure of the underworld who rules vice by a wave of his hand and spends millions with the lavishness of a midas.

While "The Racketeer" deals with this imposing character of the underworld, it is not wholly an underworld picture. Most of its action takes place

amid the luxury of Park Avenue and rich Long Island estates. The backgrounds are most lavish and many of the characters are of the upper strata of society. Yet throughout the action, the sinister influence of the underworld is felt.

The story of "The Racketeer" deals with a society girl, Rhoda Philbrook, who, through an indiscreet romance with a musician, falls outside of the pale. She encounters Mahlon Keene, a czar of the underworld, who helps her and her sweetheart, and then falls madly in love with the girl himself.

The machinations of fate that bring the affairs of this triangle to a tremendous climax are colorful, dramatic and thrilling.

The came a has caught the vivid personality of the actress, who began her career at the Theatre Varieties in Paris and has since become renowned in both hemispheres.

"Paris" is the spicy story of a Boston family with Mayflower ancestry who land in the French capital to prevent the marriage of their son to an actress. It is an all-dialogue production with musical sequences depicting the French theatre. And some of the lavishly brilliant scenes are made in technicolor.

AT THE VOX
Marshall Neilan, whose name has long been an outstanding one in motion pictures, was born in 1901, in San Bernardino, Calif.

At 10 years of age he made his first appearance with the famous old Morocco stock company in Los Angeles, and later played with the Belasco stock company in the same city and in San Francisco.

His family persuaded him to return to school, which he did for a few years, but it proved decidedly irksome for the high-spirited boy who dreamed of adventure. He sought the high road to romance and in his wanderings traveled all over the west, east and Europe. He finally discovered it at his own doorstep, when Ruth Roland assisted

him in obtaining a place with the original Kaem company in Hollywood.

He was her leading man for two years in a series of "thrillers." Neilan then joined Famous Players to play important parts opposite Mary Pickford in "Rags," "Madame Butterfly," "A Girl of Yesterday" and other successful productions. Afterwards he became Mary Pickford's director. He guided her through some of the greatest "hits" of her career, such as "Stella Maris," "Rebecca of Sunnybrook Farm," "M'Liss," "The Little Princess" and others.

"Tanned Legs," the fast-moving musical comedy produced by Radio Pictures, now at the Vox theatre, is Neilan's latest directorial achievement. He brings to it his wealth of experience and colorful background, treating it with that gay, humorous touch of which he is past-master.
