Picture Making Is Vacation for Rudy

Marshall Neilan got a severe shock the day he began directing Rudy Vallee in "The Vagabond Lover."

CHICAGO, Jan. 24, (AP)—The Dundee family of Baltimore will receive no more professional attention from Jackie Finkelstein, welterweight champion of the world.

MAIL COURSE TAUGHT RUDY TO PLAY 'SAX'

Song Idol Listened To Records of Masters.

Those who aspire to musical heights and haven't the money to study abroad may take heart from the success of Rudy Vallee.

Rudy, whose first all-talking musical photoplay, Radio Pictures' "The Vagabond Lover," comes to the Vox theatre, learned voice by listening to great singers on the phonograph, and acquired his orchestral background through a correspondence school.

Rudy Wiesdorf, celebrated musician, was the head of the correspondence school. It is to his influence that Vallee owes both his success and his first name. (He was born Hubert Prior Vallee).

Rudy never had time to train his voice—so he used to sit for hours listening to the tones of Caruso and John McCormack, reproduced via the phonograph.

Since Rudy Vallee graduated from Yale University in 1927, he has become the nation's foremost radio and night club idol—and according to critics who have viewed his first picture, he will prove himself more popular than ever in "The Vagabond Lover."
