

COPCO GROWTH REPORT MADE

Shareholders Get Letters; Klamath Activities Given Mention

Local shareholders of the California Oregon Power company have recently received an excellent report covering the activities of this company for the past three months.

The report contains many interesting details concerning construction progress, property acquisitions, and general business conditions. The following paragraphs have been quoted herewith from this quarterly letter to local shareholders.

Construction
Line 20, the new 110,000 volt transmission line extending from Dixonville to North Bend, Oregon, has been completed and was energized for the first time November 2. This new line connects the system of the California Oregon Power company with the Coos bay division of the Mountain States Power company, where a new 10,000 kilowatt addition to the Coos bay steam plant is now under construction.

In connection with the construction of line 20, line 12 which extends from the Prospect No. 2 hydro-electric plant to Springfield, Ore., a distance of 125 miles, was re-insulated throughout, the voltage being raised from 65,000 to 110,000. The completion of the above projects will improve service in the territory served by both the California Oregon Power company and the Mountain States Power company by supplying a double source of power through the inter-connected transmission systems.

Bonanza to Sprague River
A new 34,000 volt transmission line approximately 23 miles in length has recently been constructed from Bonanza north to the town of Sprague River, Ore. This new line, a three-phase circuit and operated for the time being at 34,000 volts, will serve the new electrically equipped mills of the Lorens Lumber company as well as many new residences and business customers in and about the community of Sprague River.

It is interesting to note that a new record for line construction was established by the Klamath division in building the Sprague River line, the entire 23 miles of line being constructed in just 26 working days.

Build Sub-Station
In the Umpqua division farming conditions throughout Douglas county have been very satisfactory during the past season and there have been more rural extensions built than at any time in past history. A still greater increase in farm load throughout this division as well as all southern Oregon is anticipated for the coming year.

Actual construction work on this new Medford sub-station is now under way and it is expected to have this splendid new addition to the company's Oregon properties completed by May 1. This new, modern sub-station is being built to take care of the increasing business in and about the city of Medford and to insure adequate service for the future needs of this important section.

Property Acquisitions
The Klamath division office building in Klamath Falls which has been leased by this company since 1922, has recently been purchased from the First National bank, former owners. In addition, the company also purchased the adjacent building in order to take care of the rapidly growing needs of the Klamath division headquarters.

The above property is located at the corner of Fourth and Main and is one of the most desirable locations in the Klamath business section. Several changes and improvements will be made in the near future, including the construction of modern show windows and enlargement of the present sales room to provide for the steadily increasing business of the merchandise department.

Merchandising
The Copco merchandising department, which was organized in 1927, made an excellent showing for the past year, the six Copco electric appliance stores reporting total appliance sales for 1929 of \$270,000, which is a gain of 41 per cent over 1928.

Inasmuch as the total number of residence customers in the merchandise area amounts to only 11,602, it is felt that this is a truly remarkable record. The added annual revenue which should accrue from the appliance sales of the merchandise department is expected to amount to approximately \$64,000 a year.

Preferred Stock Sales
The company has continued the sale of its 6 per cent preferred stock, series of 1927, for which there is a regular demand throughout the territory served. Over 750 new stockholders were obtained during the year 1929 and a net total of 10,539 shares of this stock was sold.

Sales are restricted to the territory served by the company, (although by special provision old stockholders residing elsewhere can purchase an additional 10 shares). The price of the stock has been \$101 per share since February 1, 1929.
