NOTED BISHOP PASSES TODAY

Rev. Anderson Succumbs
To Effects of Heart
Attack Last Week.

CHICAGO, Jan. 30. (AP)—The Most Rev. Charles Palmerston Anderson, presiding bishop of the Protestant Episcopal church of the United States of America, died today.

The passing of the Episcopal primate leaves his church without a head, and his diocese without bishop or coadjutor bishop. An election of coadjutor bishops who would succeed Bishop Anderson was called yesterday, scheduled for the diocesan convention here next Tuesday.

To Choose Successor
A special meeting of the House of Bishops will be necessary to choose a new presiding bishop, since no provision is made for an automatic succession.

Bishop Anderson had been elected at such a meeting last November 13 in Washington, after the death of Most Rev. John Gardner Murray, October 3. He assumed the additional duties immediately.

Ohio Bishop Acting Head
Upon the death of Bishop Anderson, Right Rev. William Andrew Leonard of Cleveland, bishop of Ohio, became acting head of the church. To him falls the duty of calling a meeting of the House of Bishops in years of service.

Held Post Two Months
Apostle of world peace and church unity over a span of nearly a half century, the Most Rev. Charles Palmerston Anderson was destined to stand at the head of his denomination in the United States only two months.

His election to the primacy in November, 1929, crowned 43 years of church service and 25 years as bishop of the Chicago diocese. During those years he forged into world prominence as an advocate of Christian unity and as a builder.

Moya Confesses He Murdered Aged Man

DENVER, Colo., Jan. 30. (AP)—William Moya, 32, this morning confessed, police say, that he had slain Joseph Zemp, 80, last Monday, and then hid the body under the floor of an out-building on the aged man's premises.
Moya said, according to the police, that Zemp had become enraged and threatened him because he (Moya), who occupied the upper floor of the old man's house, had looked up his rooms and taken Zemp's papers to city hall on instructions from the police after he had reported Zemp missing.
Moya said, having been in a sanatorium undergoing medical treatment.

Today's Markets

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 30. (A. P.)—Eggs, butter and buttermilk prices went on another toboggan ride today.

Butter offerings especially were liberal at the Portland produce exchange session, forcing extras down 2c to 38c; standards down 2c to 37c, and prime firsts down 1c to 36c. Firsts were unchanged at 34c.

Butterfat hit the grade at the rate of 3c a pound. The Portland delivery price is now 38c. Eggs were less eager in their plunge. Fresh extras, standards and fresh mediums declined 1c each.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the United States department of agriculture says:

"Trading continues fairly good on Portland's wholesale fruit and vegetable market. A few lines of southern produce are moving into retailers' hands too slowly, necessitating some price reductions. Cauliflower and spinach from California declined. Quality of southern offerings is widely variable, and much stock of rather poor quality is available, at low prices.

"Potato prices continue firm at shipping points, and loadings at Yakima and southern Idaho points are liberal this week. The Portland and California terminal markets are only steady though, and demand is but fair. Potato unloads at Portland are considerably less than actual consumption, indicating some withdrawals from local storages.

"California naval oranges show much improvement over earlier offerings. Prices will probably remain rather high throughout the entire season, but quality is generally excellent. Daily orange shipments at present are only 50 per cent as heavy as at this time last year."
