CITY BARBERS ADOPT CODE

Edsell Vice President of State Educational Council Board

The Klamath Falls Master Barbers' local No. 123, first such organization west of the Missouri river, has approved and adopted the code of ethics of the Associated Master Barbers of America and have posted the code in each of the shops of the city.

The Oregon Master Barbers' association has also appointed a master barbers' educational council to formulate and distribute lessons to all barbers in the state for the improvement and benefit of the service to the public and the profession.

Edsell Vice-President
A. C. Edsell, Klamath Falls, has been elected vice-president of the educational council. Other officers are R. Z. Baxter, La Grande, president; F. P. Penner, Portland, secretary-treasurer; Roy Neer, secretary of the state board of barber examiners, and all presidents of local master barber associations are members of the council.

James Swensen is president of the Klamath Falls Master Barbers' association, which was formed here in April, 1925.

Code of Ethics

The code of ethics which the Klamath Falls shops have adopted follows:

Today's Markets

PORTLAND, Feb. 6. (AP)—Egg and butter quotations were firmer today, but no changes were announced. Supply and demand were more evenly balanced than for some time.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the United States department of agriculture says:

"Limited volume of home-grown bunched carrots and green onions are appearing on the market again. These stocks are of better quality than the bedraggled condition of their above-ground portions would indicate. Spinach from nearby districts, and from Walla Walla, is expected within a week or so.

"A slight decline in lettuce prices is a direct reflection on weaker shipping-point conditions, in the Imperial valley. Other California vegetables are in moderate supply, and prices are barely steady, on account of only ordinary quality of most of the present arrivals. Cauliflower continues barely steady, although quality is very good.

"Tomatoes advancing to \$5.50 per lug, but trading is limited. Total truck holdings of about 60 cars marks the heaviest volume on Portland team tracks in several months. Forty per cent of this total consists of potatoes however, and liberal California diversions are decreasing their volume of holdings, locally."

PORTLAND, Feb. 6. (AP)—In a rough wrestling tilt here last night Bob Myers, Portland, one of the outstanding candidates in the country for the middleweight title of the world, defeated Kara Arslan Pasha, Turkish mangler, two out of three falls.

Myers won the first fall in 25 minutes with a wristlock. Pasha evaded the count in 13 minutes with a crab or stepover hold. In trying for another crab hold after having Myers in a bad way from headlocks, Pasha went down and out when Myers used both feet in freeing himself and piled on the Turk for the final fall. The time was 15 minutes.

Harry Demetral, Chicago, scored an unpopular referee decision over Tarro Miyake, Japanese jiu jitsu expert, after both had won a fall in the preliminary.
