Nina Mae McKinney, who was called from the chorus of "Blackbirds" to play the vampire role in King Vidor's first dialogue film, "Hallelujah," at the Pine Tree theatre now, with an all-colored cast and a deal of harmony, is an interesting person.

When she went to join the company in Tennessee last fall, Nina Mae, who is only 15, knew that she had to work hard to get the coveted role, and if she got it she didn't know but what she might have to go back to the chorus. But when she left the Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer studio the ink was just drying on a five-year contract that she had signed with Irving Thalberg.

"And I got a bonus besides from Mr. Mayer, and good wishes from everybody for my holiday," she said, increasing slightly the happy smile which, when she isn't weeping or looking sad for cameras, is the usual way in which Nina Mae keeps her more than ordinarily good-looking dusky face.

When Nina Mae was being interviewed, she was with William Fountaine, the villain of the picture, Eddie Connors, one of the Dixie Jubilee Singers, who has a character part, and Evelyn Pope Burwell, a graduate of Union university and holder of a degree in music from New York university, also a jubilee singer, and whom Vidor nicknamed "Hot Shot."

"Nina Mae is all the rage in Harlem now," said "Hot Shot." "I always thought Nina Mae was a child that was bound to be famous, and I still think I'm right. And her admirers are keeping her up pretty late, sitting around in her house till all hours, playing the piano, and looking at pictures, and mugging."

"I'm not going to marry, either," Nina Mae said. "You'd be surprised what a popular matrimonial prize I have turned out to be since I got the bank account and the contract, which says I can't get married until I get older."

"She just kisses herself through the streets," Eddie said. "All the girls kiss her, and all the men want to."

"I ain't complaining any," said Nina Mae.

REDMEN TO HOLD STATE MEET HERE

Grand Lodge Officer Says Klamath Honored by Being Chosen

The Great Council of the Independent Order of Red Men will be held in Klamath Falls the last week in July this year, the exact dates to be given out later, it was announced last night by District Deputy Grand Sachem W. H. Cochran.

The local lodge will be host to the state convention at that time and W. C. MacRae, J. N. Arnett

and W. H. Cochran have been named as a general committee in charge of arrangements.

The Great Council (grand lodge) of Oregon was incorporated in December, 1879, 50 years ago, by Representatives Adam Staender, Ward S. Stevens, and W. H. Williams, of the order. Up to this time the members in Oregon were under the authority of the Great Council of the United States.

It is considered an honor, Mr. Cochran states, for Klamath Falls to be accorded the convention on this, the 50th anniversary of the founding of the lodge in Oregon. The Klamath lodge of Redmen, Tewinsek tribe No. 73, is one of the youngest lodges in the state.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 20. (A.P.)—The Johnson bill proposing construction of an \$80,000 constant frequency monitoring radio station was reported to the senate today by its commerce committee. Selection of the site would be left to the secretary of commerce who is understood to favor Grand Island, Nebr.
