

GIRL SPRINTER IS SENSATION IN 60 METERS

Stella Walsh Makes Fast Time of 7:05 at Toronto Meet

TORONTO, Feb. 21, (AP)—Many track stars from the United States and Canada are wearing new Canadian indoor championship crowns today, but leading honors for last night's meet go to two sprinters, Stella Walsh, Cleveland girl star, and Leigh Miller of Hamilton.

Miss Walsh Wins

Miss Walsh won the 60-meter women's dash from a pair of her leading Canadian rivals, Myrtle Cook of Montreal and Florence Bell of Toronto. Her time was 7.5-10 seconds.

Miller, who recently defeated Jack Elder in New York, finished ahead of George Simpson of Ohio State, the "fastest human" in the final of the men's 60-meter sprint. Johnny Fitzpatrick of Toronto, who also conquered Elder, was third.

Other stars won their races easily and in comparatively slow times.

Swim Wins 1,000 Meter

Dr. Paul Martin of Switzerland took the 1,000 meter run in 2:34 1-5. Jimmy Ball of Winnipeg, Canada's great Olympic star, scored as easily on the 30 meter event in 36 4-5 seconds. Harold Osborn of Chicago leaped 6 feet 3 1-4 inches to win the high jump title, while Vic Pickard of Hamilton needed but 12 feet 6 inches to nose out two Detroiters, E. Reich and R. K. Goeris, in the pole vault.

Arthur Keay of Toronto likewise had an easy victory in the 3,000 meters. Monty Wells, Boston hurdler, found his only competitor in E. Spence and R. K. Goeris of Detroit.

Phil Edwards, negro middle distance star of New York University and the Canadian Olympic team, won the 600-meter event in 1:24 2-5. He also participated in several relay events.

BETTING ODDS FAVOR FIELDS IN FRISCO GO

SAN FRANCISCO, Feb. 21, (AP)—Jackie Fields, welterweight title holder, and Young Corbett, Fresno southpaw, rested today for their ten round non-title fight at the baseball park here tomorrow afternoon.

The betting odds still favored the champion two to one, the wise ones figuring fields to solve the left-handed style of Corbett. Because he had never fought a left handed boxer, Fields made a practice of sparring with southpaws during his training for the fight.

The baseball park can accommodate 37,000 persons, and Promotor Anell Hoffman figured a gate of around \$45,000. Fair weather seemed likely for the outdoor contest.

Fields and Corbett are about the same in physical measurements, with the champion having a slight height and reach advantage.

PLACE BOXING AND WRESTLING ON HIGH PLANE

Statewide Organization Proposed By Salem Commission

EUGENE, Ore., Feb. 21, (AP)—A statewide organization of boxing and wrestling commissions for the purpose of instilling greater confidence in the minds of the followers of the sports and to protect matchmakers and the public from un dependable participants in the game probably will be effected soon if a movement started in Salem is successful.

Salem Takes Initiative

The Salem boxing and wrestling commission adopted a resolution inviting the chairmen of all boxing and wrestling commissions of the state to meet at Salem at a date to be appointed at which time the organization would be effected with officers elected and general plans of operation discussed.

Harry Powell, secretary of the Eugene commission, received a copy of the resolution today.

Whole State Invited

The towns included are Salem, Albany, Eugene, Medford, Klamath Falls, Chiloquin, Marshfield, Bend and Astoria. Eastern Oregon cities including Pendleton, Baker, La Grande, Enterprise and others will be invited to attend.

The chief function of the organization would be to prevent last minute walk outs on the part of the fighters matched for a card and to provide a sort of board of appeal to settle questions arising from disputes concerning the status of a boxer or wrestler, Powell said.

Glenna Collett Invading Britain

NEW YORK, Feb. 21, (AP)—Glenna Collett, national women's champion, has secured four recruits for her forthcoming golf invasion of Great Britain this summer when the first women's international team match in history is to be played.

Miss Collett, who is captain of the American squad, said she had received tentative acceptance from Maureen Orcutt, of Englewood, N. J., Helen Hicks of Hewlett, N. Y., Bernice Wall of Oshkosh, Wis., and Mrs. Dorothy Campbell Hard of Philadelphia.

Molly Gourlay of Camberly Heath, is to captain the English team.

Caton Only Permanent American in All Russia

MOSCOW, Feb. 21, (AP)—Throughout the Soviet union, which is three times the size of the United States, the only permanent American resident is Samuel W. Caton of Cleveland, Ohio.

But Caton has even greater distinction than this, for he is also the greatest jockey in Russia. On the famous Moscow race track, reminder of the days when racing was the sport of Czar and Kings, American tourists to Russia saw Caton win his sixth derby and his one hundredth victory of the season.

Greatest Jockey in Union

Even the greatest Russian harness race drivers acknowledge Caton to be the greatest jockey of his day in the Soviet union. Caton's winnings in Russian trotting races are considerably less than they would be on American tracks. But the popular American driver was born

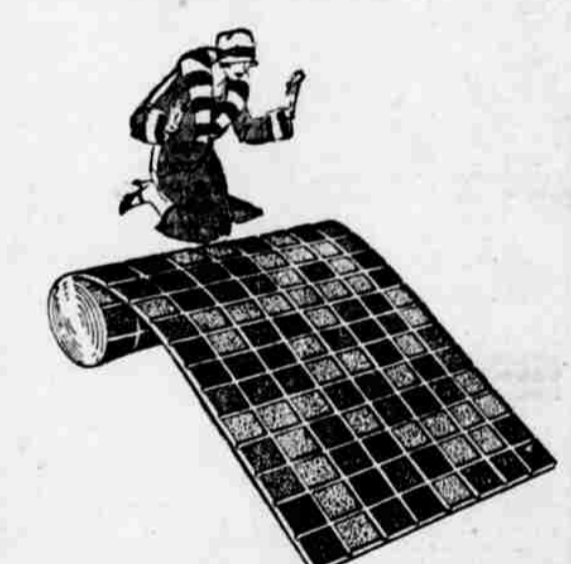
