## Rep. Glynn Dies On Return From Friend's Funeral

WASHINGTON, March 6. (AP)—Representative James P. Glynn of Connecticut died on a Chesapeake & Ohio train about 6 a. m. today, while returning from Huntington, W. Va., where with other members of Congress he had attended the funeral of Representative James Anthony Hughes.

Representative Glynn was 63 years of age. Mr. Glynn arose early and went to the smoking car to finish dressing. He suddenly collapsed, apparently suffering a heart attack, and died in the arms of P. H. Crook, assistant sergeant-at-arms of the house, who was in charge of the special car.

## Viscount Gladstone Dies of Bronchitis

LONDON, March 6. (AP)—Viscount Herbert John Gladstone, youngest son of the Victorian statesman, William E. Gladstone, died today of bronchitis. He was 76 years old. His illness began in January.

Lord Gladstone through most of his adult life was prominent in politics and in the councils of the liberal party. He was born at No. 13 Downing street in 1854, when his father was chancellor of the exchequer. He served in parliament, and once was home secretary.
