Today's Markets

PORTLAND, March 6 (AP)—Egg and butter prices remained weak and unchanged today.

In fruits, oranges were 25c a box higher, ranging from \$4.25 to \$5, according to size, and in vegetables cabbage has soared to 5c a pound.

Reviewing the general fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland Bureau of the United States Department of Agriculture says:

"Cool weather continues to delay maturity of cauliflower at Roseburg, with the result that Portland's supply is light, and the market continues firm. Only one carlot shipment has been made from that district, and little shipping activity is expected until next week.

"Apples are moving slowly, for all classes except the cheaper sorts, which can be sold to retailers and peddlers at \$1 or less per box. Even this poorer stock is showing only moderate movement, thereby prolonging the marketing period for these lots. Wrapped and packed apples are confined mostly to wineries and yellow Newtowns, with a few supplies of delicious, Arkansas blacks, and other varieties. Spitzenberg stocks are about depleted.

"Asparagus of the same grade that sold at 25c per lb. in California is selling to Portland retailers at 30c—obviously an unprofitable margin.

"Hothouse rhubarb from Puget Sound points, which costs Portland jobbers \$2.17 per 20-lb. box of extra fancy stock, is selling to retailers at \$2.25 per box, another instance of the very narrow margin upon which many products are being distributed."

PORTLAND, March 6 (AP)—Cattle and calves: Slow, quietly steady except bulls 35c to 50c lower; receipts, cattle 75, calves 10. Bulls (yearlings excluded) beef, good to choice \$7.75 to \$8.25, cutter to medium, \$6.00 to \$7.75.

Hogs: Steady; receipts 600. Sheep and lambs: Quietly steady; receipts 350. Ewes, 120 lbs. down, medium to choice, \$5.00 to \$6.50.

PORTLAND, March 6 (AP)—Butter: Weak, unchanged.

Eggs: Weak, unchanged.

Milk (buttermilk), poultry, country meats, onions, potatoes, wool, nuts, hay, cactus bark and hops steady and unchanged.
