Pumpkin Pie?

Mash fine 2 cups cooked pumpkin. Add 1½ cups milk. Beat 3 eggs and to them add a pinch of salt, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, ½ teaspoon cloves, ½ teaspoon nutmeg. Stir this into pumpkin mixture and then fill baked pie-crust with it. Bake until custard has set and crust is done.
