Today's Markets

PORTLAND, March 8 (AP)—Egg and butter quotations continued barely steady with the opening of the market today. The egg movement into storage has become quite general.
Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland Bureau of the United States Department of Agriculture says: "Lettuce shipments from the Imperial Valley continue very heavy, with volume of loadings during the last two weeks unprecedented in the history of the valley. The tremendous consuming capacity of the American public, for this product, is shown in yesterday's shipping-point report of 'market firm for best stock' with prices slightly higher than former levels. At Portland, good fresh lettuce is selling to retailers at 13.00 per crate, while older, wilted stock is cleaning up at a 50 per cent discount."
Oranges and grapefruit are firm, with price advances in a few sizes.
"The onion market continues very unsatisfactory. Weaker eastern markets are confining Oregon's distribution to the Pacific coast."
"Motor-truck receipts of Roseburg cauliflower are increasing in volume, but no carlot loadings are in immediate prospect."
