

HOUSECLEANING ESSENTIAL FOR WELL KEPT CAR

Hupp Factory Reminds Owners Removing of Mud Inefficient

Automobile housecleaning time is here—just as the first warm days of spring entice the modern housewife to wash windows, beat the rugs and remove the heat in general, so should the first touch of warm weather remind the automobile owner to prepare his car for the greater amount of driving he will do in the warmer months, according to Bert Roberts, Hupp factory representative for this territory. "At one time, the average motorist thought that removing the winter mud from beneath the fenders was sufficient. Now, however, the well kept motor car is cleaned from stem to stern, inside and out," Roberts declared.

Suggestions Offered
"Here are a few simple suggestions prepared by our service department which should assist every owner in putting his car in shape for summer driving.

"First, have the car washed and vacuum cleaned. Clean and polish all bright metal parts and accessories as well as all interior hardware and mountings.

"In washing, the owner should be sure that the under parts of the car, such as the spindles, running gear and steering arms are as clean as possible. This provides easier steering and quicker operation of the car. Now that you have washed the 'face' of the car, the next job is to put its internal organs in working condition.

Radiator Treatment
"Hupp recommends, as do the manufacturers of radiators, that special treatment be given the radiator in the spring to assure perfect service. First, a cleaning solution recommended by the manufacturer, should be poured into the radiator and the engine run until thoroughly warmed to permit this solution to circulate forcibly throughout the cooling system. Then the radiator should

be drained and flushed with clean water while the engine is still running, so that the cleaning solution is removed from the various inner parts of the cooling system. All radiator hose should be inspected and in many cases replaced by new hose, as the old ones often break from the effect of hot water in fast summer driving. The pump shaft and gears should also be examined and packing reinforced or replaced to eliminate leaks. Especially should the exterior of the radiator be washed to remove foreign matter from between the cells or coils.

"If you want the best possible operation from your engine, have it inspected by your local service station. Among the items which should be checked are condition of spark plugs and the spacing of the spark points; valve and tappet clearance; condition of the main connecting rod and piston pin bearings; adjustment and condi-

tion of the distributor points; and inspection of all steering rods and connections. Likewise, the entire wiring system, both for ignition and for lighting, should be checked and for replacement of damaged wires and poor connections. Fuses and coils should also be checked. "There are two other features about your car which have an important bearing on its economical and safe operation. These are the proper alignment of wheels with the takeup of all wheel bearings, and the cleaning and adjusting of all brakes so that they function properly. Still another feature to be watched is the correct adjustment and focus of the headlights, and the replacement of dim bulbs.

"Changing the oil for spring and summer driving means more than refilling the crankcase with a heavier lubricant. The oil should first be removed and the crankcase flushed, preferably twice. The best obtainable grade of oil recommended for your car will be an economic factor in the long life of the engine. The wheel hubs and axles, the pinion bearings and the steering arm knuckles should be thoroughly cleaned and lubricated with new grease. Both the transmission and differential should be drained, flushed and then filled with the proper lubricant. Remember that it is always safe to use the lubricant recommended by your dealer."

The playoff series between Portland and Vancouver for the league championship will start Monday at Vancouver and will be resumed here Thursday.

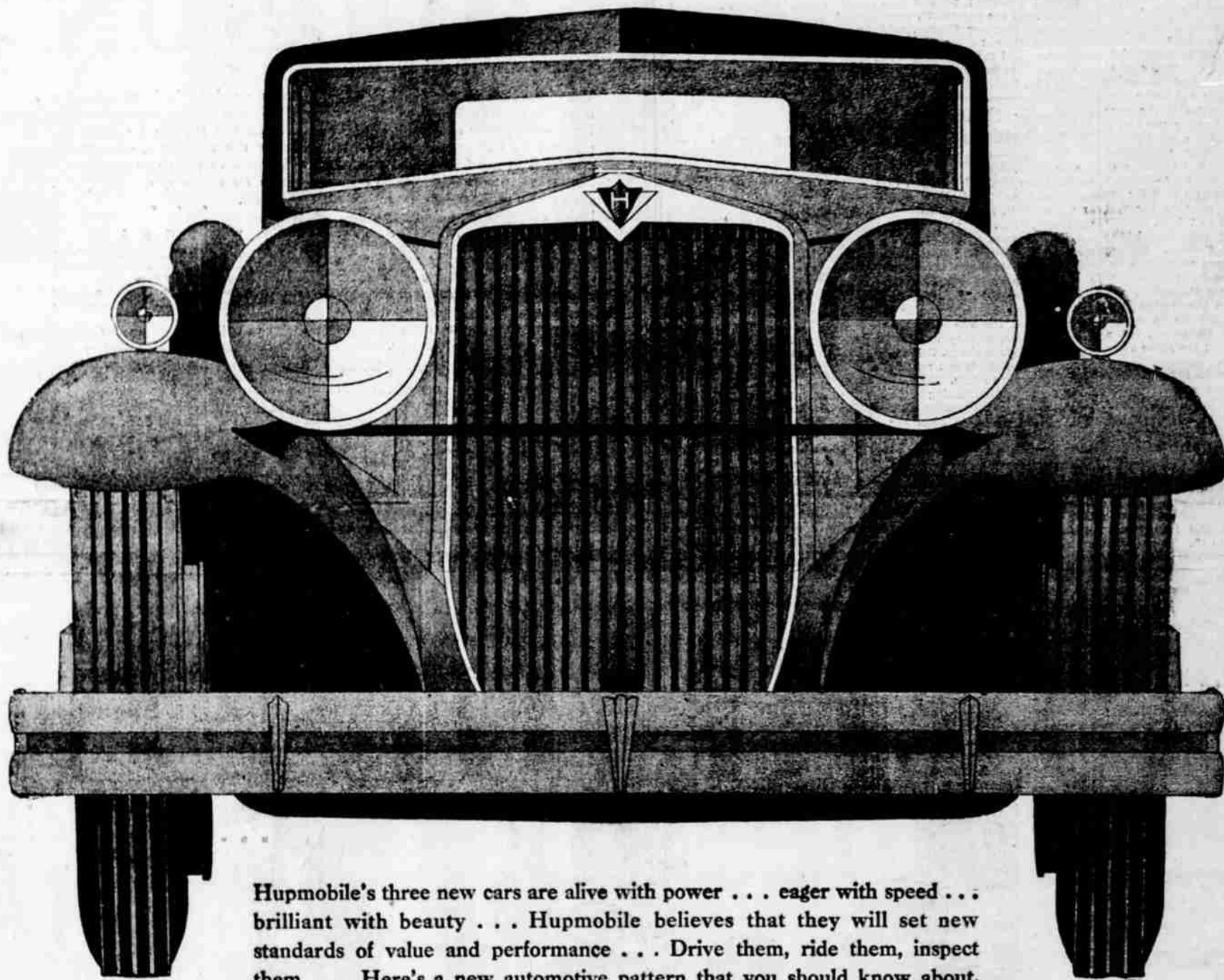
Portland and Vancouver will enter the final round tonight in the same position they have occupied much of the season—deadlocked

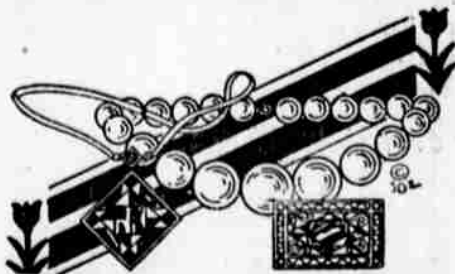
