

KLAMATH ELKS LAY PLANS FOR CELEBRATION

"Days of '49" Pageant Is Planned for Fourth Of July

The Elks lodge last night voted to sponsor a "Day of '49" four-day celebration, including the Fourth of July this summer. A feature of the celebration will be a 10-acre town of the old style with all the fixtures of the town of the early day.

Only local people will be allowed concessions which will be run by the Elks and no solicitations, or donations will be asked of the merchants or local people. The show will be advertised throughout the state of Oregon, California and Arizona.

Manager Experienced
Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Zerby, who for the past 12 years have managed such shows in Flagstaff and Globe, Ariz., will arrive here on June 1 to plan and manage the affair. Mr. Zerby, whose office is in Houston, Texas, was here last night and laid the plans before the lodge which then unanimously endorsed the affair.

Members of the American Legion were present last night and went over plans with the Elks lodge. The Legion has been invited to join the Elks lodge in sponsoring the affair. The matter will be before the Legion executive committee on Monday night.

To Be Large Affair
Approximately 250 persons, all local, will be employed in staging the celebration which will be one of the largest ever held in the northwest, it is stated.

A. L. Rice, George Canning and Elbert Vatch were last night named a committee in charge and more will be added to the committee later.

A feature of the fête will be the taking of pictures by the Pathé News service.

Many years of experience with celebrations fits Mr. and Mrs. Zerby for their work. Mr. Zerby has been in such work for 27 years and only recently completed managing the Galveston, Texas, Mardi Gras.

May Sponsor Nine
Last night the Elks appointed a committee to communicate with the Astoria and Bend lodges in regard to the formation of a baseball league in southern Oregon. The Bend and Medford lodges have indicated that they will sponsor teams this summer.

The Klamath lodge will favor such a league if only local talent players are allowed to play and if no high-priced "stars" are employed on any of the teams.

Newly elected officers of the lodge will be installed by the lodge here the first meeting in April when the officers will initiate a large class of candidates.
