

ARRAIGNMENT ON CONSPIRACY FACED BY GROUP

Grand Jury Finds Case Against Six Persons in Bribery Trial

LOS ANGELES, March 21. (A. P.)—Six persons named in grand jury indictments on charges of bribery and bribery conspiracy today will appear for arraignment before Superior Judge Walton J. Wood, as the next step in the reopened Julian Petroleum Corporation investigation.

Berman in List.
Those indicted on information out of the investigation of the 1928 Julian juror bribing scandal include S. C. Lewis, former head of the oil company; Jacob Berman, alleged jury fixer; Frank Grider and John R. Groves, members of the jury that acquitted the defendants in the Julian fraud trial.

All but Krause made bail of \$5000 each and were released from custody. Krause, unable to make \$25,000 bail is being held in the county jail.

Bribery Charged.
The two Bermans and Krause were named in one indictment that charged them with conspiracy to commit bribery. Lewis was charged with giving and offering to give bribes to members of the jury. Grider and Groves face charges of asking, receiving and agreeing to receive bribes.

Mrs. Caroline Love, another juror who admitted negotiations with Lewis, through J. H. Weaver as his representative for a bribe of \$10,000, was not indicted but was placed under technical custody to appear for further questioning when the grand jury reconvenes next Tuesday. Weaver also is held in technical custody.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 21. The officers were also to go to San Quentin prison to question Albert Marco, convicted Los Angeles "underworld boss" in whose trials Krause is suspected of having tampered with the jury.

Four Youths On Mussel Rock Wait For Lowering Tide

SAN FRANCISCO, March 21. (AP)—Trapped on Mussel Rock, a craggy "island" just off the ocean shore south of San Francisco, four youths today awaited the coming of low tide to return to the mainland.

The four, Mario Johnson, Stanley Garri, Charles Maloney and George Crukolph, all of Daly City, and two other youths whose names were not obtained, waded out to the rock at low tide yesterday, intending to remain until the next low tide.

The evening tide did not run low enough to suit the quartet, although the other two boys waded ashore. When the four finally called for help Jan Jalink, a coast guardsman, swam out to them with a line and offered to help them ashore but they refused and elected to remain throughout the night.

No Solution Found For Wage Problem

PORTLAND, Ore., March 21. (AP)—After a three and one-half hour conference with the wage committee of the street car men's union, officials of the Pacific Northwest Public Service company, formerly the Pacific Electric Power company, were

no nearer a solution the wage problem than before today.

Franklin T. Griffith, president of the utility, said that March 27 had been set as the date for another conference at which he would hear union officials ask for a wage increase for trolley car employes.

The demand for a special prosecutor came from the state game

commission and from the sportsmen. It is said that authorities in Curry county have been unable to get any case to trial. The trouble is said to have been brought to a head by the recent seizure by the Curry sheriff of a quantity of salmon that was being cured by local game officials to be held for evidence. The game officials had previously taken the salmon from the alleged illegal fishermen.
