

IDENTITY OF WOMAN'S BODY STILL PUZZLE

May Be Mrs. Preston Of Redding, Authorities Now Believe

EUREKA, Calif., March 27, (A.P.)—Possibility that the body of the attractive young woman found slain Monday beside the Redwood highway, 60 miles north of here, is that of Mrs. Gladys Preston of Redding was again being investigated today, following the news last night that two women, who each had been identified as the victim, are alive in Southern California.

Marks Identical
Belief that the slain woman might have been Mrs. Preston, missing from her home since February 9, gained support when a brother telephoned Sheriff John Runner that two of his sister's toes were grown together; that she had undergone an operation for appendicitis, and that she had a scar from a burn on her left arm.

Examination of the body disclosed that the second and third toes of the left foot are grown together. A scar was also found on the right side, corresponding to that described by Mrs. Preston's brother. Due to the condition of the body, which had lain in the rain beside a log for weeks, Coroner Oscar Swanson was unable to say whether the left arm bore a scar.

Brothers Give Evidence
Mrs. Preston's brothers said their sister left her husband and three small children February 9. They also suggested that authorities seek Harry Tusten, who, they said, disappeared from Redding about the same time.

Two other "positive" identifications were proved false when the supposed "victims" were located in Southern California.

Ten persons examined the body at the morgue and declared the slain woman to be Mrs. Thelma Hughes, former Arcata restaurant keeper.

Mrs. Hughes Much Alive
Then Mrs. Hughes was located at her home in Long Beach. She told questioners she had come from Eureka ten days ago, and expressed surprise that her name had been mentioned in connection with the slaying.

The second identification was eliminated when Mrs. Clara Brown, also known as Claire Greenwood and Claire Clausen, formerly of San Francisco, was found in Los Angeles. Robert Mears, Crescent City mill worker, said the body was hers. Mears made his "identification" through clothing on the body.

Famous Rabbi of California Dies At San Francisco

SAN FRANCISCO, March 27, (A.P.)—Rabbi Jacob Nieto of Temple Sherith Israel for nearly 40 years, an outstanding figure in the city's religious and civic life, died suddenly last night after a brief illness. He was born in England 47 years ago.

A noted liberal, Rabbi Nieto achieved national recognition for his work in bettering the conditions of the laboring classes. He was a member of the board of rabbis of Northern California. He held the same position in the Western Association of Reformed Rabbis.

Last January Dr. Nieto was honored by Temple Sherith Israel, the congregation of which he served for 37 years, at a banquet, when he was given the title of Rabbi-Emeritus and a year's leave of absence.

Dr. Nieto came to San Francisco in 1893. The widow, two daughters and a son survive.

Social Life of Days Prior to War Revived

LONDON, March 27, (A.P.)—Bright spring weather today attracted a crowd to Buckingham Palace gates to witness arrival of guests—in cocked hats and knee breeches—for King George's first levee since his illness. The scene recalled pre-war days, as not since then have the levees been held at Buckingham Palace. Today's ceremony took place there as the result of the use of St. James's Palace to house the naval conference.

A Dress Affair
The scene today was a brilliant one, with civilian guests arriving in picturesque court attire and members of the army, navy and air services wearing full dress uniforms.

King George was dressed in the blue and gold of an admiral's uniform and remained seated on a golden throne throughout the ceremony surrounded by officers of state in magnificent array. The Lord Chamberlain announced loudly the name of each of the 600 guests who bowed before the majesty.

To Hold Five Courts
With King George's return to normal health assured, there has been a greater rush of applications for presentation at court than ever. Debutantes from the United States and the dominions figure largely in the lists presented to the Lord Chamberlain and it has been decided that five courts will be held this year by the king and queen. The appearance of the king

himself at the courts will make the present season one of the most brilliant since the war.

Fashionable dressmakers already are booking orders for court dresses which comply with the court regulations and curtsy classes for debutantes already have begun.

Renee Adoree In Hospital for Rest

LOS ANGELES, March 27, (A.P.)—Suffering from a severe throat and bronchial affection, Renee Adoree, film actress, today is confined in a La Crescenta, Cal., sanitarium.

Dr. Patrick J. Byrne said her condition is not serious but no visitors will be allowed to see the actress at present. He said she probably will remain in the sanitarium until next August for a complete rest.

Friends said the actress has been suffering from a bad cold for several months, and it became suddenly worse recently while she was on a trip to Mexico City. Miss Adoree, who came from France to work in motion pictures, scored her greatest triumph in the war drama "The Big Parade." She played the leading roles in several silent pictures, but has not appeared in the audibles.

Mexican Officers Capture Bandits

MEXICO CITY, March 27, (A.P.)—A dispatch to the newspaper Excelsior from Tepic today said that the three bandits who had kidnapped J. E. Bristow, American oil man, were captured when they entered Tepic to negotiate for ransom.

Their names were given as Emilio Perez, Jose Guerrero and Jose Guerrero Jr.

The account says that Mr. Bristow was the victim of his own impudence in entering a part of Nayarit, which is beyond civil and military control, and against which he had been warned. It was said he had located a gold vein and disregarded the advice.

General Pablo Rodriguez has dispatched troops after the remaining bandits.

Waving Signal Flag Only Wobbling Babe

WHEELER, Ore., March 27, (A.P.)—The wobbly legs of an infant whose body was covered with a red sweater and which made the tot look like a waving red flag caused the engineer of a Southern Pacific passenger train to ground to stop near Adair yesterday, thereby saving the boy's life.

Junior Wilks, whose age is figured in months, wandered from home and onto the railroad tracks. He toddled along the tracks until the engineer roaring around a curve, saw the waving figure in red.

Junior returned home unharmed.

Hemorrhage Kills Harding's Skipper

PLYMOUTH, England, March 27, (A.P.)—Captain William Rind of the United States liner President Harding, died suddenly of cerebral hemorrhage aboard his vessel here today.

Captain Rind was taken ill on the bridge of his ship a few hours before arriving in harbor. The body will be embalmed while the President Harding is at Cherbourg, and will return with the ship to America.

Green Twig Arrow Stops Power Service

MEDFORD, Ore., March 27, (A.P.)—A small boy and his arrow caused the entire city some inconvenience here last night.

An arrow, made of a green sap soaked twig, was shot from the bow by the boy in such a manner that it fell across two high tension wires.

Since that time the play has been seen in virtually every British province as well as every American state, having been grouped into road companies and stock groups.

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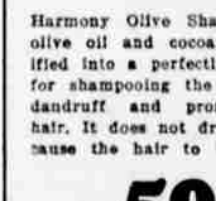
