MARKET QUOTATIONS

PORTLAND, April 8. (AP)—Because of increasing supplies as compared with the demand, the butter market has developed a weak tone and a price reduction would not be surprising. Current quotations were declared to be out of line with the general situation. Butter in storage was said to have reached large proportions.

The egg market was steady with prices unchanged and with supplies plentiful.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the United States department of agriculture says:

"Cauliflower was firm with considerably lighter supplies and practically no competition from California. Roseburg's loadings are limited to about one carload daily, and the deal is expected to terminate soon, so far as carlot shipments are concerned. Sales to retailers ranged from \$1.50-1.75 per crate of No. 1 cauliflower.

"California asparagus weakened to 7-9c per lb. due to increasing competition from heavier northwestern offerings, which are of generally superior quality. The Dalles, and Beaverton were added to the list of shipping districts. Both sides of the Columbia river from the Willamette to Arlington, are now moving asparagus actively. This stock remained steady today, at \$1.50-1.75 per dozen 1 lb. bunches.

"Rhubarb supplies are heavy, and 4c per lb. marked the day's top sales, generally.

"Distribution of potatoes by the East Alder street wholesalers is inactive, due to continued liberal supplies moving direct from farmers to retailers.

"Lettuce shipments continue in the neighborhood of 250 cars daily, 90 per cent of which are from Arizona. Fancy hard lettuce still commands the satisfactory price of \$4.00 or higher, to retailers; much of the present offerings are of \$2.50 quality though.

BUTTER: Weak, unchanged. Eggs, milk (butterfat), poultry, country meats, onions, potatoes, wool, nuts, hay, cascara bark and hops, steady and unchanged.
