SAN FRANCISCO, April 10. (AP)—The Pacific Coast league baseball season entered its third day today. Los Angeles' Angels were the only team of the eight in the loop able to boast 1,000 per cent in the standing. Ed Baecht, hurling great ball for Los Angeles, took Portland down the line for the Ducks' second straight loss, 9 to 2, in the southern city yesterday.

Pirates Trade B. Grimes To Boston Braves

PITTSBURGH, April 10. (AP)—Pittsburgh baseball fans were stunned today by the news that Burleigh Grimes, ace of the Pirates' pitching staff, had been traded to the Boston Braves. It was known here the breach between the spitball artist and his employers had not lessened, despite the numerous conferences throughout the late winter months, but the trade was wholly unlooked for.

President Barney Dreyfuss said he looked upon the trade as the best way out of the difficulties when Grimes refused to come to terms, and he let it be known that Percy Jones, who comes to the Pirates in the trade, was one of two men selected by Manager Jewel Ens as the pitcher to be sought for Grimes.

Besides Jones, a "large cash consideration" was included in the trade. Grimes' demanded a \$20,000 salary and a two-year contract from Pittsburgh.

DYNAMITE GUS TOYS WITH TED

Portland Grappler Has No Chance Against Heavier Man

PORTLAND, April 10. (AP)—"Dynamite" Gus Sonnenberg, generally recognized as the world's champion heavyweight wrestler, had little difficulty in defeating Ted Thye, Portland, the former world's light heavyweight champion, in two straight falls here last night. In doing so, the champion showed he carried other tricks in his bag besides his famous flying tackle. He used headlocks, body scissors, short-arm scissors and leg splits to good advantage, and did some clever blocking of Thye's pet hold, the wristlock. Sonnenberg took the first fall in 35 minutes, 15 seconds after starting a headlock attack and completing the job with a flying tackle. After the first fall Thye never had a chance. Daring Thye with a couple of rabbit punches, Sonnenberg flopped him over with a headlock, and it was all over in 12 minutes.

Thye Dangerous Once
Thye caused the champion a few anxious moments with his wristlocks in the first session, and seemed in a fair way to gain a fall, but they were too close to the ropes to complete it. When Thye got the same hold in the center of the ring, Sonnenberg broke it by sheer brute strength.

Chet Wiles, Portland traffic cop wrestler referee, and Harry Dementral, Chicago, staged a lively 30-minute preliminary that ended in a draw, neither gaining a fall.

DOLAN KAYOS WELCH
BAKER, Ore., April 10. (AP)—Taking advantage of his greater height and reach, Jimmie Dolan, Portland, last night knocked out Freddie Welch, Seattle, after a few flurries of punches in the second round of a scheduled ten-round main event. Dolan weighed 149, Welch 148.

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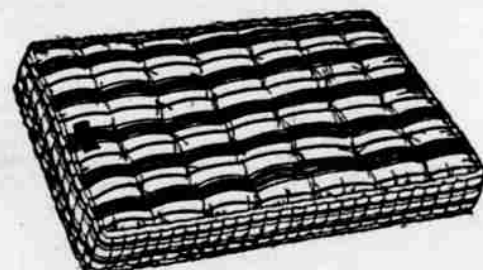
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
