

Herald's Bowling Tournament Gets Under Way

EIGHT BOWLERS TURN IN SCORES ON FIRST NIGHT

Eagerness for Diamond Medal Prompts Early Start; Bowlers Urged to Get Games Going Early as Alleys Will Be Crowded Later on. Good Scores Rolled in First Games.

Well, they are off; the Herald Diamond Medal tournament has started.

Eight of the contestants have bowled three or more games of their first round. L. G. Drake, known sometimes as "the old war horse" but considered by many as the dark horse of the tournament, shot three of his games and with his handicap bowled fair to stay for another round. His scores were 152, 166, 212, and with 10 pins to the game as handicap totals him for his first 5-3 of the round, 536.

Peterson Gets Pine Start
W. A. Wilson with a handicap of 25 pins pegged up a nice total, 618. C. E. Peterson with the aid of a 231 score in his 5th game and a 14 pin per game handicap shot 1154 in six games.

Ed. Norin with a 11 pin handicap per game totaled 1100 for six of his games. E. E. Valente was much off his regular form but essayed to bowl six of his games and as his average is quite high he did not get much help from a handicap, only 6 pins per game. His 1923 with a good three game finish might keep him still in the running.

Miller Starts with 1272
Dick Miller bowled some mighty nice ten-pins in six of his games. With a 19 pin handicap he totaled 1272, with a dandy score of 244 in his fifth game.

W. Caldwell with a 30 pin handicap, totaled 554.

Miss Bobbie Sherman with a handicap of 40 pins, totaled 478 for three of her games.

Remember, there are nine games per round so, if you are entered in the tournament be sure to bowl some of your games early in the specified time, as you are likely to find the alleys crowded later in the week.

Helen Lawson in Race for Honors of State in Golf

TROJAN TRACK SQUAD SLATED TO BEAT CARDS

LOS ANGELES, April 11. (AP)—The Stanford university track and field team, somewhat of a mystery at present, arrives this morning and will work out on the Occidental College track where tomorrow they meet the University of Southern California in a dual meet. The winner will enter as favorite in the 1930 I. C. A. A. A. competition in Boston.

Live Up to Expectations
The Trojans, on paper the strongest dual meet aggregation ever produced by the southern California institution, in competition to date has lived up to expectations, and will meet Stanford favored to win by anywhere from 5 to 20 points. Against the University of California these Trojans turned in an unheard of 195 to 28 victory. If Stanford falls before them by even a small margin they will go to the I. C. A. A. A. favored to defend their inter-collegiate title successfully.

Rowing Supremacy of West at Stake At Seattle Today

SEATTLE, April 11. (AP)—The eyes of the rowing world were turned today toward Lake Washington, a picturesque body of water at the northern edge of this far western city, where the famous crews of the universities of California and Washington were to battle for Pacific coast supremacy for the twenty-second time.

Great Crowd Expected
Nearly 100,000 persons, the greatest crowd ever to witness an athletic event in the Pacific Northwest, was expected to watch one of the most colorful and dramatic spectacles in the West. Many began locating advantageous points of view on the shore of the lake early today for the event, which was scheduled for this afternoon. Others were preparing to board boats and airplanes for closer-up views of the races.

Weather Favorable
Clear skies and fair water were forecast by the weather bureau. Although only a light wind was predicted to blow out of the north, the weather observer said it might reach a velocity of from 14 to 18 miles an hour, which would slow down the time of the shells and make it unlikely that new records would be established.
