

TO DEBATE ON GOVERNMENT

Students Will Meet on Question of Cabinet For State

Should Oregon adopt a cabinet form of government?

That is a question which people of the state of Oregon will soon be carefully considering, since, in the election this fall, this question will be put to the vote of the people. A fine way to learn more about this question would be to attend the debate at the auditorium of Klamath Union high school Tuesday evening, April 15.

Two affirmative debaters of K. U. H. S.—Ruth Lind, first speaker and rebuttal speaker, and Arthur Bremer, second speaker—will meet Medford high's negative team here April 15. The question will be: "Resolved, that Oregon should adopt the cabinet form of government."

A cabinet form of government as is proposed would mean the number of elective offices would be reduced from seven to three, eliminating the attorney-general, secretary of labor and commerce, superintendent of public instruction, food and dairy inspector, and leaving only a secretary of the treasury, secretary of state, and governor.

All other departments and boards would be consolidated into nine boards with a director over each. These directors would be appointed by the governor with the consent of the senate. The nine boards would consist of agriculture, labor and industry, financial administration, commerce, public works and domain, health and public welfare, state police and military, legal affairs, and education.

A system of this sort would do away with a great many evils of the government, as there would not be so many small, petty boards, which tend to corrupt politics.

The judges for the debate will be instructors from the Ashland Normal school.

The winner of this debate will debate the winner of the Marshfield-Roseburg debate for entrance in the semi-finals, which will be held April 25.

The winner of this debate will be considered champion of entire southwestern Oregon.

Milnor Heads All Grain Operations

CHICAGO, April 11, (A.P.)—Geo. S. Milnor, formerly vice president and general manager of the grain stabilization corporation, has been named president in charge of all operations.

W. G. Kellogg, general manager of the Farmers' National Grain

corporation, who was president of the stabilization corporation, has been named vice president and a member of the executive committee of the stabilization corporation. Other officers are S. J. Cottingham and E. V. Maltby, vice presidents; C. E. Huff, secretary, and W. M. Buckles, treasurer. Milnor, Huff and Buckles also are members of the executive committee. Mr. Milnor said no change in policy was contemplated.

HOUSE MOVES TO FORESTALL RAIL MERGING

WASHINGTON, April 11, (A.P.)—Appointment of a committee to request the interstate commerce commission to defer action on the proposed merger of the Great Northern and Northern Pacific railroads, was agreed upon today at a meeting of representatives of six Northwestern states.

Republicans Act
The committee included representatives Buttress, North Dakota, chairman; Clague, Minnesota; Williamson, South Dakota; Leavitt, Montana; French, Idaho; Summers, Washington, and Butler, Oregon. All are republicans.

This action follows up the introduction of a resolution several days ago by Representative Knutson, republicans, Minnesota, to suspend the authority of the interstate commerce commission to approve any railroad mergers until congress acted to protect the public interest.

I. C. C. Approved Merger
The meeting today was called by Knutson, and was attended by 15 representatives of the states traversed by the two rail lines.

The proposed merger has been tentatively approved by the commission upon the condition that the company officials agree to certain terms, including disposal of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy.

Soldiers Escape Prison Stockade

TACOMA, Wash., April 11, (A.P.)—Breaking from the stockade, two Fort Lewis soldiers under heavy prison sentences, escaped last evening and at an early hour today they had not been apprehended, although large bodies of men were combing the woods and underbrush adjacent to the fort. The two are John C. Lino, 22, and Charles Riley, 29. They are under sentences of eight and five years, respectively, for alleged theft of pistols from the fort arsenal. A plot was uncovered in connection with the theft that they planned later to hold up the camp paymaster and steal the soldiers' monthly pay roll, it is reported.

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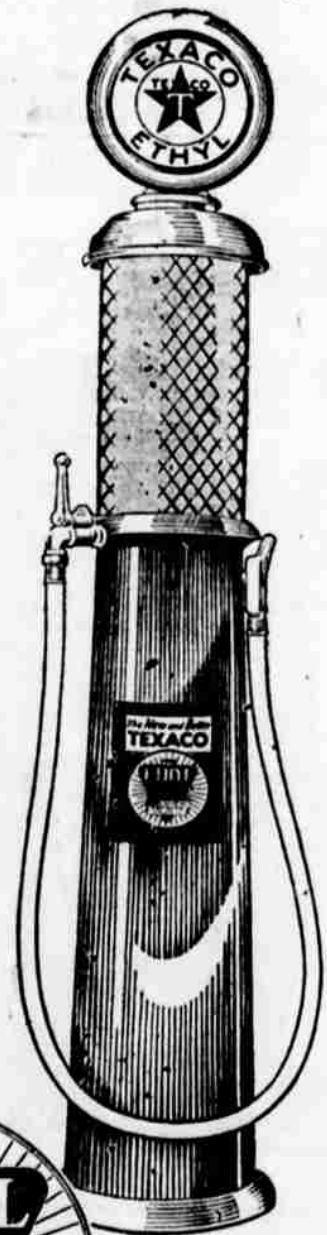
