Hogs: 130, all direct; cattle 30, sheep direct, 15. Week's totals approximately: Hogs 4960, cattle 1495, calves 105, sheep 1840.

HOGS: Compared week ago, 40 to 60c lower. Bulk light butchers, \$10.25 to \$10.50, with one deck early Monday at \$10.75 and nothing over \$10.25 after Monday. Over and under weights, \$10.15 down, heaves down to \$9.00 and below. Packing hogs mostly \$7.50 to \$7.75, odd head smooth \$8.00 to \$8.25. Slaughter pigs and light hogs averaging under 150 pounds, \$9.50 to \$10.00. Bulk feeder pigs for week, \$10.25 to \$11.25, several lots Monday \$11.50 to \$12.00.

CATTLE: Compared week ago, steers and heifers 50 to 75c higher. Bulls steady to strong. Calves and weaners mostly 50c higher. High medium to good steers mostly \$11.85 to \$12.50; less desirable kinds \$11.75 down, but common grades seldom stopped below \$9.50. Strictly good heifers quoted up to \$11.25. Good cows up to \$10.90. Bulk desirable she-stock \$9.00 up. Low cutter and cutter \$4.50 to \$7.25. Mixed steers and heifers on baby-beef order Monday at \$12.25 to \$12.35 and two loads of outstanding heifers Thursday at \$11.50.
