

PRISON QUIET FOLLOWS DAY OF GRUMBLING

Guards Amazed at Turn
Taken by Convicts
At Columbus

COLUMBUS, Ohio, April 25, (A.P.)—Apparently accepting restoration of prison discipline, convicts in the Ohio penitentiary, where 320 prisoners lost their lives in a fire Monday, went to breakfast in an orderly manner early today.

Warden Not Removed
Canteens and hootings were absent, and for the first time in four days the men marched with a firm, snappy step. Guards expressed amazement at the demeanor of the men, who only yesterday were a howling mob, refusing to abide by the orders of their keepers and refusing to heed orders until their demands for the removal of Warden Preston E. Thomas were met. The warden was not removed, however.

Another about-face in the "passive resistance" campaign was seen when eight convicts volunteered to relieve twenty convicts who have shoveled coal in the power house almost constantly since the disaster.

Another Fire Predicted
An unnamed convict appeared voluntarily in Warden Thomas' office today and said that one of the prisoners in the section which burned had announced Sunday that "this block will be on fire tomorrow." The fatal blaze occurred Monday night.

The convict was said to have named the man who made the statement. He was turned over to the state fire marshal for further questioning. Prison officials said the name of the informant would be withheld.

As the governor's committee investigating the fire went into session the death toll was increased to 320, as another convict succumbed to pneumonia in the prison hospital.

James Andrews was the latest fatality.

Lindy Hops Off
From Washington
For Miami Field

WASHINGTON, April 24, (A.P.)—Charles A. Lindbergh took off from Bolling field for Miami, Fla., today at 9:45 a. m.

He said he expected to make the flight of 923 miles in one hop, arriving in Miami late today.

Lindbergh's mother, who accompanied him yesterday on his flight from New York, returned to New York by train last night.

Going to Havana
Lindbergh will leave Miami tomorrow afternoon, arriving in Havana tomorrow night, with the first batch of mail to be taken southward on the inauguration of the new seven-day air mail schedule of the Pan-American Airways, Inc., between New York and Montevideo, Uruguay.

From Havana he will fly to Cristobal, Panama, and remain there, to fly back with the mail at an undetermined date in the near future.

Commission Adds
Eight Patrolmen

PORTLAND, April 25, (A.P.)—Acting on a request from Hal Ross, secretary of state, the state highway commission late yesterday decided to add eight highway patrolmen to the 42 now on duty, instead of the 16 Ross asked.

The eight additional patrolmen, the commission said, would cost the state highway department \$60,000 a year. The highway commission agreed that the efficiency of the highway patrol department was decreased by being undermanned.

Jess Darling of Eugene, Ore., appeared before the commissioners and offered a 30-acre tract of land on Sitouco Lake to the state for park purposes.

Portland's Joan of Arc Object of Attack by Women

PORTLAND, April 25, (A.P.)—Three women faced charges of disorderly conduct today, following a brief demonstration at St. John's last night against Mrs. Ann Schrader, much in the public prints recently, who was billed at a recall meeting as "Portland's Joan of Arc."

Mrs. Schrader, whose affair with Police Lieutenant Breuning resulted in considerable confusion in the Portland police department and resulted in Breuning's suspension, was speaking in behalf of the recall against Mayor Baker and the remainder of the council when a woman in the audience cried: "What about the jewelry Lieutenant Breuning gave you?"

Resented Insult
The "Portland Joan of Arc" immediately left the rostrum rather than the steel such as the original Joan used, and started toward the woman. Other members of the

audience became excited and notified St. John's police. Although there was no half-pulling, it was said one of the three women arrested, kicked Mrs. Schrader. The three women arrested gave their names as Mrs. Laura Harris, Mrs. Grace Dale and Mrs. Beatrice Kelly, all of Portland. They were released on \$100 bail each.

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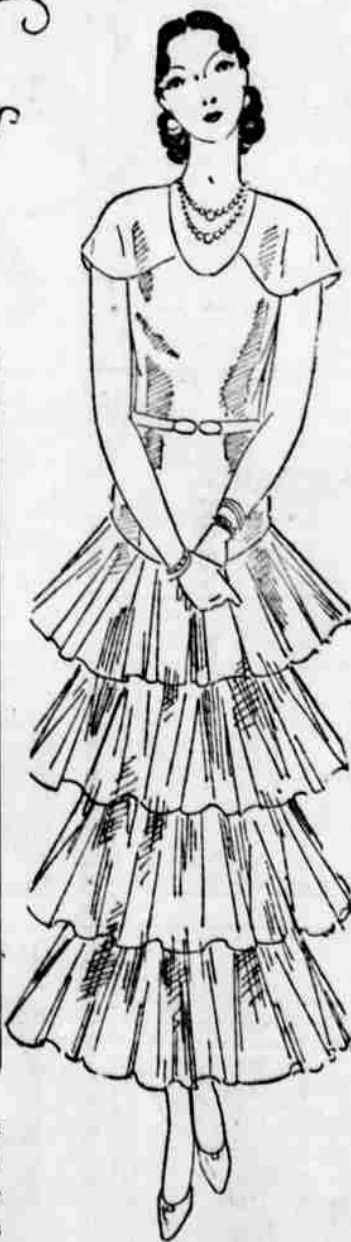
