MARKET QUOTATIONS

PORTLAND, April 29. (AP)—Butter, eggs, milk (buttermilk), poultry, country meats, onions, potatoes, wool, nuts, hay, cascara bark and hops, steady and unchanged.

SUGAR (sacked basis): Steady. Cane, fruit or berry, \$8.10 per cwt. Beet sugar, \$4.95 cwt.

FLOUR (city delivery prices): Family patents, 49s, \$7.20; whole wheat, 49s, \$6.30; graham, 49s, \$6.30; bakers' hard wheat, 49s, \$6.60; bakers' bluestem patents, 49s, \$6.60; pastry flour, 49s, \$6.70.

CATTLE: Receipts 50, calves 10. Steady for steers and 25-50c higher for she-stocks and 35c for steers. Steers, 1100-1300 lbs., \$10.75-11.25; 950-1000 lbs., good \$11.25-11.55; medium, \$10.25-11.25.

HOGS: Receipts 250, including 105 direct; talking around steady.

SHEEP: Receipts 400, including 299 on contract. Quotably steady.

Egg and butter prices were without change today.

Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the U. S. department of agriculture says:

"California strawberries were in liberal supply, and of good quality, with no hold-overs from last week. Movement was good, at \$2.50-2.75 per 24-pint crate, to retailers.

"California prices advanced to \$2.25 per crate, on account of declining supplies. California shipments are decreasing.

"The market is still oversupplied with local radishes, and retailers bought at 15-20c per dozen bunches.

"First supplies of new-crop northwestern head-lettuce are now being received at Seattle and Portland. Cool weather is retarding further strawberry receipts, from Oregon producing districts.

"Peas are advancing in price, from their abnormally low levels of last week.
