Vicious Drive Is Feature Of Simpson Running Form



By W. D. GRIFFITH, Director of Ohio Relays. From the standpoint of the man who fires the gun at the start of each preliminary heat and each final race, George Simpson is the ideal sprinter.

George Simpson never has believed in trying to "beat the gun" or to outguess the starter. Probably no other sprinter has been set back fewer times for breaking, and simply because the fastest human stays on his marks until the gun is fired.

Orthodox Starting Form. His starting form, revised slightly to meet the increased elevation of starting blocks, is still the orthodox method most common in American competition.

When the words "Get set" are given, his back comes up until it is level and his weight comes forward to the last fraction of an inch he can gain without losing his balance.

At the sound of the gun, Simpson's long legs drive him forward at almost a 45-degree angle while his right arm drives up level with his chin and his left arm comes back straight.

Simpson's full stride is almost vicious, a pounding, springy expression of speed that is joy to the followers of the sport.

Simpson never spares himself in a race, never "coasts" in a final and probably would not know how to take it easy if he were told to do so.

SPECULATION CENTERS ON ENTRY NUMBER

Kentucky Derby Has Race Followers Guessing

LOUISVILLE, Ky., May 13. (AP)—With the Kentucky Derby only four days off, speculation today centered on the number of thoroughbreds that would go to the post when the bugle sounds "hoops and saddles" for the fifth race at Churchill Downs Saturday.

The \$20,000 added mile-and-a-quarter speed and endurance test this year is not expected to have a record field. Nineteen horses, all colts, were listed today among the probable starters, with likelihood that several would be withdrawn before Saturday, bringing the number to accept the issue down to fifteen or less.

"Derby Trial" Today. Nine derby eligibles will compete today in the fifth race at the Downs. The race, dubbed "The Derby Trial," is for three-year-olds at the mile distance, and will give the postesters a line on who has the best chance to defeat the derby favorite, Gallant Fox, winner of the preakness at Pimlico last Friday.

Gallant Fox, owned by William Woodward, Chicago, is not expected to race at Churchill Downs before he starts in the derby, but Sydney, Johnson N. Camden's speedy colt, is entered in the derby trial today. Sydney is the principal hope of loyal Kentuckians who are delighted when a Kentucky horse triumphs over an outside entry in the classic.

Naito Not in Derby. Naito, though conceded an excellent chance to score an upset in today's feature, is not expected to run in the derby, which would mean that no filly would be entered in this year's running.

Des Anderson, Salem, Ore., defeated Jack Kruger, Port Orchard light heavyweight, in the preliminary.

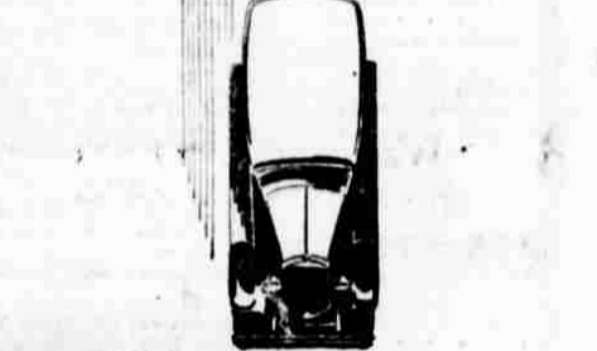
