MARKET QUOTATIONS
PORTLAND, May 21, (AP)—Several large independent dealers were reported to have reduced their buying and selling prices on eggs 1/2, following reductions at other coast markets. The Washington Co-operative was said to have made a substantial cut. The official quotations in Portland remained unchanged, however, since no action toward reduction is announced by the Pacific Co-operative Poultry Producers, who control about 60 per cent of production in this territory. The supply situation was said to be growing more top-heavy daily.

Butter prices were fairly steady following Tuesday's delivery. Demand is not very heavy, but generally about equalized. Reviewing the fruit and vegetable situation, the Portland bureau of the U. S. Department of Agriculture says: "Strawberry supplies are light and no one is excited about the fact. Demand is very slow, due to continued cold rainy weather. Many berry growers report their berries rotting on the ground; and this week's receipts of Oregon berries at Portland mostly show watery condition, and generally poor texture. Best offerings are from Banks. Some of this stock is very good. Hood River is just starting to ship strawberries now. Eastern berry markets are in excellent condition, with rather high prices generally prevailing. Cantaloupes are now in plentiful supply, at moderate prices. Like strawberries, though, their movement is very slow, due to unfavorable weather. Meanwhile, apples are moving with regular mid-winter volume, and Washington apples are now arriving at about the rate of a carload daily, by motor-truck.

"Asparagus is scarce, growth being hindered by weather conditions. Prices advanced sharply today." "New potatoes and cabbage are both cheaper. Local cabbage is rapidly replacing California stock at Portland." SUGAR (sacked bass): Steady. Cane, fruit or berry, \$4.90 per cwt. Beet sugar, \$4.75 cwt. FLOUR (city delivery prices): Steady. Family patents, 49c; \$7.00; whole wheat, 49c; \$6.10; Graham, 49c; \$5.90; bakers' hard wheat, 28c; \$6.20; bakers' Blue-stem patents, 49c; \$6.30; pastry flour, 49c; \$6.50. BUTTER: Fairly steady, unchanged.

EGGS: Weak, unchanged. MILK (butterfat), poultry, country meats, onions, potatoes, wool, nuts, hay, cascara bark and hops, steady and unchanged. CATTLE: Receipts 200, calves 15. Steady. HOGS: Receipts 200, including 91 on contract. Steady. SHEEP: Receipts 900, including 247 on contract. Quotably steady. Lambs, 84 lbs. down, \$4.75-5.50; 84 to 92 lbs., \$4.00-5.50; 92 lbs. down, \$3.50-4.75. Yearling wethers, \$3.00-4.00. Ewes, \$2.75-3.50; 120-150 lbs., \$2.50-3.25; all weights, common, \$1.00-2.50.
