

ARMED BANDIT ROBS ACTRESS AND HUSBAND

Marion Nixon Loses Two
Costly Rings; Hubby
Short \$575

LOS ANGELES, Cal., May 30, (AP)—Follow today are searching for an armed bandit who last night robbed the Santa Fe chief, Chicago bound, as it left the Los Angeles station, hauled his way into a Pullman car, and seven minutes later dropped from the train and escaped in the darkness after robbing Marion Nixon, screen actress, of rings valued at \$7,500 and taking \$575 from her husband and another passenger.

Locking the porter in the vestibule, the robber entered the car and forced his way into the first compartment, occupied by Miss Nixon and her husband, Edward Hillman, of Beverly Hills. Hillman was robbed of a wallet containing \$400 and two rings, one a four and one half carat diamond solitaire valued at \$4,400 were taken from Miss Nixon. The bandit returned Miss Nixon's wedding ring when she pleaded with him not to take it from her. The actress left the train at Pasadena, while her husband proceeded on to Chicago.

Robert G. Lehman, Detroit, Mich., banker, was counting his money when the bandit, gun in hand, stepped into his compartment.

"I was an easy victim," Lehman said. "I had my money about \$175 in my hands, and when I saw that gun and a determined masked face I willingly paid the price."

Ruby Keeler, actress-wife of Al Jolson, the singer, saw the bandit in the hallway and locked herself in her compartment. She refused to open the door when the man rapped for admittance.

Although the holdup was completed before the train had cleared the Los Angeles yards, no report was made until Pasadena was reached at 10:30 p. m. The robber, victims said, wore heavily masked and was dressed in a blue denim jumper similar to those worn by train men.

Fair Board Plan Horse Barn Building

The Klamath county fair board yesterday issued a call for bids for the construction of a race horse barn, to contain 20 stalls. Contracts for the repair of the roofs of the barns, the grandstand and the exhibit building were let to Fisher, Thorsen and company of Portland.

In further preparation for the annual fair which will be held the third week in September, the board let a contract to O. R. Mueller to furnish 500 flowering plants to be planted on the grounds.

A landscape gardener is already at work planting some shrubs and trees along the sixth street side of the grounds and around the exhibit building.

The fair board has been crowded for the past several years for sufficient barn room at the fair grounds to properly house all the entries.

This year a string of harness horses, jumpers and also some race horses will be a feature of the daily entertainment. The addition of the horses to the program made it necessary to construct the additional barn. It is planned to have the barn completed by July 4.

Announcement of the plans and contracts was made by the chairman of the fair board, R. E. Bradbury.

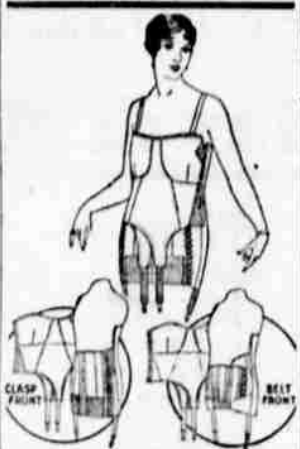
