Two Sparring Partners Take Sleep Producer In Training

Willie Feldman, the Jewish fighter who faces Cyclone George Dixon in the super fight of the year next Tuesday evening, is back in form again—the form that he showed before thousands of fans around New York. Willie was always a stiff puncher and had many kayos to his credit until he hurt the duke that put 12 opponents to sleep. It was necessary to favor that right hand for a long time and throughout that rest, Willie won his fights by out-boxing his opponents.

The hand is sound as a bell again and the way Feldman mauls his sparring partners he finds it difficult to get boys to work out with him. Willie put the scales yesterday at 163 1/2 pounds and expects to enter the ring around 160, his best fighting weight.

A Grudge Affair
The fans may rest assured this scrap is a grudge affair. Dixon, after signing for a "big shot" and after he put his name on the dotted line to appear here, tried to duck his agreement. After Matchmaker Joe Bickerstaff made a special trip to Portland and laid the contract and terms before the Portland boxing commission, Dixon changed his mind. He was to be barred from fighting in Oregon if he didn't live up to the contract, so he will not take any chances with Feldman and will try and stop him as soon as he connects with his famous right. He sure knocks'em down when he shoots and connects with that duke.

Dixon sends word that he is training hard and will show at his best when he faces Feldman. Willie is all confidence himself and will stand up and fight it out with this "fat head" as he calls him and if anybody hears the birds sing it won't be Willie. The only time Willie was ever stopped in the ring is credited to this negro battler from Portland and Feldman's one desire is to get Dixon in the ring again and promises the fans they will see a fighting Hebrew with but up thousands of dollars and that is why he is so keen.

A big preview for the fans has been arranged for Sunday. Dixon and party will arrive Saturday evening and will display his wares Sunday at the Legion arena. It is worth losing a good dinner to see this great colored battler train.

Schmeling Without Sign of Complex, Inhibition or That Failing Called Temperament

ENDICOTT, N. Y., June 5. (AP)—Max Sigfried Adolph Otto Schmeling is an engaging young man without a complex, inhibition or sign of unruly temperament to his lengthy name.

As he sits in the living room of his well-guarded cottage, playing over and over a gramophone record, he doesn't even talk a good fight. Yet one week from tomorrow night in the Yankee stadium this 24-year-old Teuton, who has scaled the heavyweight heights in two short years, will battle Jack Sharkey for the highest prize fistiana has to offer. He will fight the best he knows how, cannily, carefully, evenly, but at a terrific pace, and if his best is not enough—well, he is still 24 years old, and life even in a fistie sense, still leads long before him. Max may lose to a better man. He frankly admits that may happen, but he doesn't think that man is Sharkey.

Indian Brown Color
Colored an Indian brown by the sun in his outdoor workouts, the young German is a picture of snapper condition as he lolls in his easy chair, happy to talk of fights in his halting English, liberally sprinkled with German phrases when the subject gets complicated and thoughts come too fast. His high cheek bones, shaggy black eyebrows, deep color and animation leave an indelible impression of Jack Dempsey when the old man-mauler weighed 187 pounds and was eager to tear the world apart with his iron fists.

"I hope to beat Sharkey," he said, with a smile and a wave of both hands. "I do not know. No one knows. If I get my chance I win. If not, I lose."

To Schmeling, almost a fatalist in his attitude toward the coming contest for ringdom's highest stakes, this statement covers the entire situation. By "chance," which he pronounces "shenke," Schmeling means the opening or situation that will give him the upper hand and pave the way to victory. The breaks may come his way—or they may go to Sharkey.

"If Sharkey wins, I congratulate him. The same way I would congratulate myself if I win. But why should I lose?" he asked.

"Sharkey is a good boxer, yes? He hits, punches good with left hand, no, well, maybe I make him discouraged if he can't hit me with his best punch. That is important."

Style Won't Count

"I do not know how I fight Sharkey. In my training camp I have twenty sparring partners. I fight them all. They have different styles. No matter what style Sharkey fights, I am ready for him."

"Sharkey is a good boxer, yes? They say I can't hit a good boxer with my right hand. They say he will defend against my right all the time with his left hand and I never hit him. That is foolishness. He must punch at me sometime, not? When he punches at me he moves his hands, yes? When he does that he leaves an opening, right? Then I can punch. Then I will hurt Sharkey. Maybe my shenke comes then."

Dan Howley of Cincinnati Becomes Leading Experimenter And Trader of Major Leagues

Dan Howley, manager of the Cincinnati Reds, has become one of the leading experimenters of the National league, as well as one of its leading traders, and he has prospects of good results if he can mold the material he now has into a co-ordinated baseball team.

The Reds as they are now seem to have everything but the ability to make their hits count. They get plenty of blows, 84 of them in their last seven games, and frequently have good pitching to go with them, but still they lose the close decisions and games in which they have the best of the hitting.

Shakeup Helps

Howley shook up his lineup again yesterday, putting Pat Crawford in the lineup and making Bob Musel lead off. The result was good enough to produce 14 solid hits, but not a victory. Their opponents, the New York Giants, got but 12 blows, but six of them came in succession from the first six batsmen in the opening inning, and started the Giants off to a 4-1 lead and an 8 to 5 victory.

American Games Tight

The American league reversed the procedure of its elder rival completely and produced four tight battles, three of them going on findings apace, and left the positions of the leaders unaltered. The leading Philadelphia Athletics beat out the St. Louis Browns, 4 to 2.

Washington, in second place, scored three runs in the tenth to beat out the Detroit Tigers 11 to 8. The Cleveland Indians and New York Yankees remained in third and fourth places respectively, the victims of upsets. The Yankees dropped an 8 to 7 decision to the Chicago White Sox, as Johnny Kerr followed the example set for him a few innings earlier by Babe Ruth, and won the game with a home run after two were out in the tenth inning. The Babe had tied the count in the seventh with his eighteenth homer of the year. Ed Morris of the Boston Red Sox proved better in the long run than Willie Hudlin of Cleveland, and gave Boston a 5 to 1 victory in another ten-inning duel.
