Gamblers Get Poor Break at Toronto

TORONTO, June 10, (AP)—After asserting that "this is the first city on the American continent that we have not been able to fix," a syndicate of gamblers were on their way out of town today, leaving a quantity of paraphernalia behind in the hands of police.

The operators with 35 employees were ordered to leave after police raided their establishment in the automotive building at Exhibition Park, just as the place was about to open for business.

"Anywhere else they would have winked at it when big doings were going on in the city," one of the syndicate, who gave New York as his address, told police.

The "big doings" were taken to mean the International convention of Shriners in session here.

The equipment seized by police included roulette wheels, dice tables, roust-n-out lay-outs and other devices.

Seventy-four enlisted men and three officers of Battery D, 249th Coast artillery, will leave here tonight at 10 o'clock on the Southern Pacific bound for the annual two-week's encampment at Fort Stevens.
