CENTRALIA, Wash., June 11. (AP)—A warrant charging Agnes Rotham, 27, Tenino divorcee, with first degree murder, was issued yesterday on complaint of R. L. Fender, deputy Lewis county prosecutor and bail was set at \$10,000.

She was the companion of Maynard Taylor, 27, Tenino cook, who was shot to death near here Sunday night on a side road by an unknown assailant.

A bill for Oregon and California land grant land in the state of Oregon to be sold to the state at the value of \$2.50 an acre and exchanged for timberland along the highways passed the senate, Wednesday, according to a message received at the chamber of commerce yesterday from Senator Frederick Steiwer which follows: "Referring to your recent letter regarding Senate bill 3557 providing for the purchase of land grants for recreational purposes by the state, I am pleased to report this bill passed the senate yesterday evening."

Senator McNary of Oregon is author of the bill and the object of it is to preserve the forests along the highways on account of their scenic and recreational value.

Robert R. Butler, representative, has been urged by the Klamath chamber of commerce to support the bill in the house.
