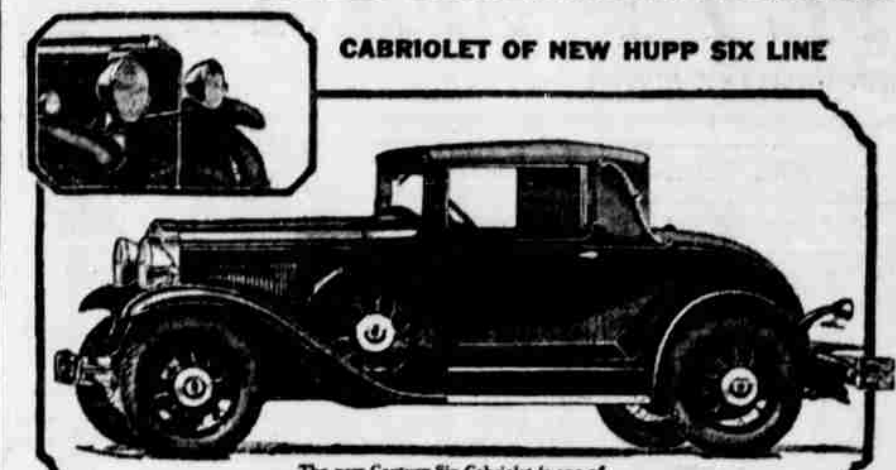

New Century Six is Larger, Longer and Heavier Than Illustrious Predecessor

DETROIT, Mich., June 14.—A larger, longer and heavier six-cylinder model, the second new car announcement to be made by the Hupmobile Motor Car corporation within the last fortnight, is publicly announced here today.

The new car, designated as the new Century Six, is named after the illustrious predecessor which established new records of popularity two years ago. But the new Century Six is a car of a different type, and its performance capacity, developing 70 full horsepower, and a speed of 70 miles an hour. Several mechanical innovations and refinements are also included, which are ordinarily found in cars of much higher price.

The new Century Six is
