Georgian Quintet Held for Slaying Trio of Gamblers

ROCKMART, Ga., June 21. (AP)—Accused of participating in a triple slaying arising from a poker game in which each of the victims was shot in the back of the head and the bodies disposed of in gangland fashion, five men were held in jail today on murder charges.

Denied bail, Bill Hulsey, his two sons, Fred and Ray, his son-in-law, Tom Hicks, and L. C. McCullough, were ordered held for grand jury action by the verdict of a coroner's jury. They were accused of killing Cliff Jones, Lige Harper and Ernest McCullough, each about 30 years of age.

Building up a chain of circumstantial evidence, authorities advanced the theory that the men engaged in a poker game and that the victims engaged the Hulseys by winning the greater part of the money at stake.
