

The LIFE STORY of MAX SCHMELING

(EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the fifth in a series of six articles on the life of Max Schmeling and tells of the rift between the Schlager and his manager, his initial fight and his knockout of tough Johnny Risko, which gave him his golden change.)

There were no brass bands to greet Max Schmeling and his manager, Herr Arthur Bulow, when they stepped down the gangplank in New York. There was not even a countryman to shout "Wiegels, landmann!"

They clashed so bitterly the difference never was settled.

Risko was the man to test the Teuton's fire. He had held his own against the best in the land. He had stopped the championship march of many. He had never felt the sting of a knockout.

After trailing for a few rounds, Schmeling suddenly knocked Risko cold. The fight made him. His name and pictures blazed from sport pages. Other cities wanted him.

Meanwhile Bulow has signed for fights right and left. He had tied up with Humberto Fugazy to have Schmeling meet Phil Scott. To raise immediate expense mon-

they could find cheap accommodations, so the two went to Madam Bey's pugilistic boarding house in Jersey.

Max's right hand, slightly injured in his fight with Fritz Dier in Berlin, was not responding to Bulow's treatment. Bulow felt their funds were too low to seek high-priced advice.

Here started the first row. Max finally overruled Bulow and went to Dr. Fraulich, who does tricks with athletes' bones and muscles. The surgeon removed a fragment of bone from the thumb, and soon the Schlager was right again.

Poor Bulow, who spoke little English, was given the run-around by the promoters and his impatient fighter chafed at the delay. In no time the boys were throwing mean little personalities at one another. Finally Bulow succeeded in getting a match with Joe Monte.

Schmeling knocked out the third-rate Monte in eight rounds, and the sports writers, not so much for the fight, but for his strange resemblance to their old friend, the Manassa Mauler, gave him a tumble. Tex Rickard saw the fight, and his far-seeing eyes took in the possibilities of building up another foreign menace.

He wanted him to go on at the Garden with Joe Socky. After another quarrel with his manager, Maxie got the fight, and neatly out-pointed the Dayton blonder.

A Crack at Risko

Now their services were in demand at Madison Square Garden, and a fight with Johnny Risko was offered. Max jumped at the chance, but Bulow was reluctant.

LINGERING COLD IS MENACE TO HEALTH

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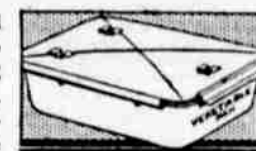
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
