"Life Preservers" for Airplanes

Choiera Epidemic Spread Terror in Frontier of '49

The following letter, now the property of Press Fidler of Klamath Falls, was sent in 1849 from Miami county to Alfred M. Fidler, Robinson, Crawford county, Illinois. The letter was folded to form its own envelope and was written on very fine paper, which is now creased and faded. The original is on display at the Baldwin Hardware Co., Miami County, August 21, 1849.

Dear Children: I have been expecting a letter from you for several months but have looked in vain nor have we heard from you except by a letter Noah received from you some months ago. As the cholera has prevailed in various parts I feel anxious to hear from you and from the rest of the friends in your country.

The cholera has taken a wide range through this country, it was pretty bad in Dayton, but none have suffered more than I have heard from than Fiyattsville and Tipacano, for their population, it is said that one third of the inhabitants have died and the town of Fiyattsville was nearly forsaken. The nearest death by cholera to us was about three miles. I believe there were some cases nearer that were not fatal.

Through Mercy we have generally enjoyed good health. All your brothers and sisters are well as far as we know. William lost his youngest child by whooping cough a few days ago. Erasmus has not been home since he was in Lebanon. At present I believe he is in Quincy where John lives. I suppose you have heard that John is married again. Emily has been living with us; at present she is living with Matilda in Dayton. Matilda has another son a few days old.

Robbins has bought a lot in Dayton and has built on it; I believe he is more industrious and it is hoped he will do better; he has invented a machine by which he can make spouting much easier and can do it cheaper consequently gets considerable of it to do. If you have much spouting to make it would be worth while to get one.

As you are now settled in the world I suppose you have now an excuse to keep you from religion. You can scarcely imagine what pleasure it would give me to hear that you have warmly espoused the cause of religion. I can assure you there is nothing so much needed and nothing can afford you so much happiness.

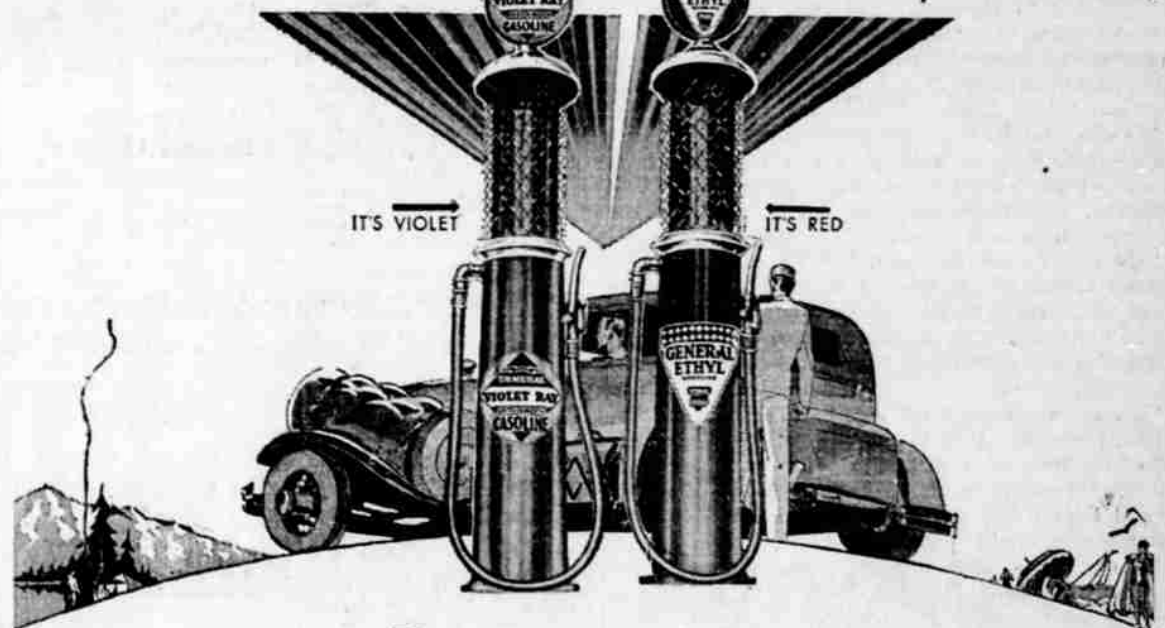
