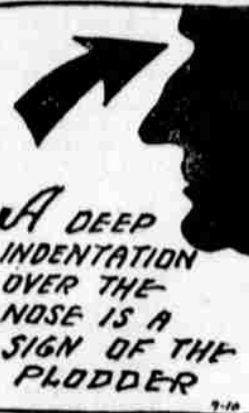

NEGRO MOTHERS INCENSED OVER DISCRIMINATION

NEW YORK, July 10. (AP)—The New York World today says that fifty-five negro gold star mothers who were to sail for France on Saturday have cancelled their reservations and have sent a protest to President Hoover alleging discrimination.

The letter to the president, signed by the 55 women, protests the segregation of the negro women, contending they should be sent to France on the basis of geographical location with the white mothers.

PORTLAND, July 10. (AP)—While top grades of butter were less plentiful and steady in price, the under grades were abundant and weaker in value. The latter were marked down 1c at the produce exchange, with prime firsts at 29c and firsts at 28c.

The egg market continued steady, especially for the higher grades.

The prices of millstuffs have been reduced, millrun being quoted at \$32 and middlings at \$42.

Wiley to Drop From Plane Over Midland Airport

Bunny Wiley, 25, who has made 1277 parachute jumps in nine years and was formerly a parachute instructor in the United States army, will jump from a plane over the Midland airport Sunday under the auspices of the Klamath Flying service.

He will jump at a high enough altitude to drop 1500 feet before opening the chute and continuing the descent.

Wiley made his 1275th jump in Klamath the last of June while employed by the Golden State Airways as stunt flier with the Ford Trimotor plane. At that time he fell 1000 feet before opening the chute.

Indicted Official Charges Laxity in Attorney's Office

PORTLAND, July 10. (AP)—A. A. Bailey, indicted county clerk, who became irked by an alleged delay in bringing Bailey to trial on a charge of engaging in politics, said he has figures to prove "extreme laxity" in the attorney's office.

Bailey said his record showed 415 indictments returned between March 5, 1926 and April 1, 1930 have not been brought to trial. In each case, Bailey said, the defendants have entered pleas but have never been tried or convicted.

Bailey said the reason he revealed the records was for personal use. Stanley Myers, district attorney, refused to comment.
