Low-Fare Excursion Starts Next Friday

Residents of Klamath Falls and vicinity

are to be given the benefit of a special low-fare excursion to San Francisco and Los Angeles, via Southern Pacific, under plans announced today by C. M. Biggs, district freight and passenger agent for the railroad here.

Low-fare tickets will be sold July 18th only. Biggs announced. Return limit on tickets to San Francisco will be July 23, while that on tickets to Los Angeles will be July 30. All tickets to Los Angeles will be honored via Stockton or San Francisco.

The sailing distance from New Orleans to Colon in the Canal Zone is 1616 miles.

COUNCIL GIVES GAS FRANCHISE

Ordinance For Benefit Cosmetics Is Brought Up

An ordinance approving assignment by the Consumers Gas company, a corporation of California, to the Natural Gas corporation of Oregon the franchise granted by the city for the installation of a gas plant and mains to serve Klamath Falls residents was passed to second reading at the city council meeting last night.

The franchise assignment is being made to an Oregon company to facilitate the project, but that the company will also be a subsidiary of Standard Oil of California as is the Consumers Gas company.

Horan stated that material has been ordered for the plant to be erected on the west side of the city across the river, and construction will start in about two weeks as soon as it arrives. The plant is to be finished by December 9, according to terms of the franchise.

To Regulate Shops
After 14 cosmetics of the city had presented a petition to the council an ordinance was passed to regulate making it unlawful to practice cosmetic therapy outside a regularly equipped shop for the purpose of adhering to the rules of sanitation laid down by the state laws.

A. W. Schupp, city attorney, explained that he drew up the ordinance upon the theory that the cosmetics should not be allowed to operate outside of shops as a means of enforcing the state measures, instead of licensing the shops or operators.

James Swensen, owner of Swensen's beauty shop, spoke on behalf of the group of shop owners present, explaining the terms of the ordinance. Mayor Walters stated that "Jimmie" should be fined a box of cigars for accompanying such a good-looking group of women to the council chambers then allowing them to sit in the rear of the room.

Shea Awarded Bid
J. P. Shea Construction company was awarded the bid for construction of the fifteenth sewer unit which includes Riverside addition. Shea's bid totaled \$34,800 which was \$113 under the engineer's estimate of \$34,913. Other bidders on the project were Dunn and Baker, and W. J. Tobin.

Recommend Lights
Councilman Butler, chairman of the light committee, recommended that a light be installed at the corner of Oak and Eleventh streets. In his report he stated that an overhead light should be installed at this corner where five streets intersect. The light committee was authorized to investigate this addition and report on lights which are needed in this section.

Grant Dance Hall Permit
An application made by E. B. Veatch, in behalf of the Klamath Elks lodge, to operate an open air dance pavilion on Klamath avenue at the site of the '49 celebration village was allowed. A similar application made several weeks ago by Dick Reed was refused, but it was stated last night that the council was then acting upon the false impression that a hall constructed of inflammable material could not be allowed within the fire zone.
