DEMANDS FOR 25 SPTS.—That all of Southern Oregon is interested in the personal visit of Jack Dempsey to Klamath Falls next Monday is the conviction of Joe "Tex" Bickersstaff, local matchmaker extraordinary, who spent several hours billing his big show in the towns of the Rogue Wednesday. Everywhere "Tex" went he found sportsmen eager to get the low-down on the show, and as a result of his visit he brought a long list of orders for ringside seats home with him.

Up to this morning the advance sale had passed the \$1000 mark. With four days to go, it appears that the house will be sold out, and that Poe's Pelican theatre will be jammed fore and aft. Tickets are on sale at the theatre box office from 10:00 a. m. to 10:00 p. m. daily. They are not on sale elsewhere, so don't get "parving" your respects to the lady in the box office. The first row ringside seats are already vanishing like the proverbial snowball, but these are not the only good seats in the house. The arrangement of the ring will be such that everybody in the house will be able to see everything that takes place.

A Great Show
As has been said before in these columns, Jack Dempsey is today the greatest drawing card in the world in things pugilistic. He is the man the public really relies upon to do the fighting toms ome and retain the title for ever. Whether he does this or not, it remains that he is the idol of fight fans. Perhaps it is because he is looked upon as the last of the really good fighters—a man who fought to win from the very first tap of the gong, and who never resorted to a foul. Whatever the reason, the public is always eager to see Dempsey and to hear what he has to say about the fight game today.

Added to the stellar attraction is a card of 36 rounds of fighting by the snappiest bunch of boys possible to pull together in a city the size of Klamath Falls. Shrimpy McDonald vs. Billy Ryan, bantamweights; Millie Mihliti vs. Young Sam Langford, welterweights; Steamboat Jackson vs. Chet Wilkins, welterweights; Austin Rosander vs. Joe Daguita, junior welterweights, and Finley Wilson vs. Johnny Sauer, bantamweights. Coast to Hawaii Yacht Race Goes To Enchantress

HONOLULU, July 17, (AP)—The Enchantress, scratch boat in the trans-Pacific yacht race from San Pedro to Honolulu, today was assured of receiving the silver replica of a Viking ship offered the first to cross the line, having arrived shortly after 10 o'clock last night, with an official time of 12 days, 7 hours, 52 minutes and 52 seconds.

The other three aspirants for the Lipton cup to be given to the boat with the best corrected time were unsighted.

The contender was reported about 100 miles from the finish line by radio at noon yesterday.

The record for the voyage was set by the yacht Mariner, owned by John Barrymore, which made the trip in 11 days, 14 hours and 46 minutes in 1922.

PURSE STRINGS LOOSEN UP FOR STADIUM BOUT

\$200,000 Gate Predicted For Mandell's Second Defense of Title

NEW YORK, July 17, (AP)—The purses of the fight faithful loosened today and piled up a pot of gold for Sammy Mandell and Young Al Singer to fight for tonight in the ring at the Yankee stadium.

Last minute predictions were for a \$200,000 gate. This will be Mandell's second defense of his lightweight title here in two years.

Some money appeared in the marts of change at odds of 2 to 1 on the sleek challenger. If the same odds prevail at ring time, Singer will be the shortest-priced challenger since Pancho Villa knocked out the aged Jimmy Wilde for the flyweight crown back in the days when fouls were something to be frowned upon.

No Foul Tonight
By special ruling of the New York state boxing commissions, there can be no foul tonight. Both the champion and the challenger have agreed to equip themselves with such protective devices as they consider will render them immune to low blows. If either winds up on the floor he will have to look for sympathy in the voice of the referee, tolling off the count of ten.

The shift in the tide toward Singer appears unjustified by past records of the gladiators, although it is generally admitted that Mandell, after eleven years of wear, has begun to show signs of whipping Husky Jimmy McLarin in the Polo arena two years ago, but since then the cloutings Celt twice has belabored the champion in over-weight matches, Sammy had a desperate time ed-

The National League's latest crucial battle is a stand-off, with perhaps a slight tinge of moral victory for the Brooklyn Robins. They got an even break as they opened a series with the Chicago Cubs with a double header. The Robins remained in first place by a three-game margin, and left the Cubs too far behind to overtake them even by winning all the remaining games of the series.

Pat Malone pitched a five-hit game, and the Cubs won it 6 to 4, but Wilbert Robinson countered with old Adolfo Luque in the second contest, and the Robins backed him up with some heavy hitting to win 5 to 3. Del Bissonette knocked himself out sliding into the plate in the first game.

War Threatens
The fans thought Gabby Hartnett was the cause of the damage, and started tossing pop bottles. Luque and his rival, Charley Root, nearly became embroiled over a "dusting off" incident, and two coaches and Manager McCarthy of the Cubs were chased by the umpires for various reasons.

Neither the Glatts nor the Cards looked like serious opponents yesterday. They both were victims of hitting sprees by low ranking clubs. The Giants lost an 8-1 decision to the Cincinnati Reds, as Red Lucas gave a few less hits than his mates made. Phil Collins kept the Cards under control while the Phillies were pounding out a 10 to 5 victory.

The second division leaders, Boston and Pittsburgh, divided a double-header. The Braves won the first contest, 4 to 2, with a sixth inning rally behind Tom Zachary's five-hit pitching, but went down, 9 to 5, in the second, although they made 13 blows, including Wally Berger's 25th home run.

A's Add to Lead
The Philadelphia Athletics added a half game to their lead over Washington by slugging out a 14 to 7 victory over Chicago, as each team made 15 hits.
